A MESSAGE FROM FATHER



Praise be Jesus Christ,

The four phases of Christian Life for us begin this weekend with the Baptism of Our Lord. I wonder how many of us fully appreciate and value the relationship we have with Jesus and the life he gave for us? This weekend may not be well known but really is a beginning gesture to us in our Christian living.

The day of Jesus' baptism is one of the pivotal moments in his life. It marks the beginning of what the Church traditionally calls his "Public Life." The life of Christ can be divided into four major sections.

The First in Jesus life was what is called his "Hidden Life." This includes Christ's infancy, childhood, and young adulthood. The Gospels record little of these years. History and tradition fill in some of the blanks, but for his first 30 years, Jesus lived a normal, relatively uneventful, working-class life. In a small town where everyone knew everyone else, he spent his days helping Mary, Joseph, and their neighbors make ends meet. We call it his "Hidden Life" because his true identity and mission were hidden from the world during this period.

The Second section is his "Public Life." This starts with his baptism and goes until the Last Supper. In this period, he traveled the highways of Galilee and Judea, preaching, teaching, healing, performing miracles, and training his Twelve Apostles. During this period, his identity as Messiah became known to the public - first with the dramatic revelation at his baptism, and then through his words and mighty deeds.

The Third period is his Passion. It goes from the Last Supper through his trials, scourging, crucifixion, and burial. This is the culmination of his mission, when he reveals the shocking depth of God's love for us sinners and offers himself as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.

The Fourth section is the period of his Resurrection. It goes from Easter until his Ascension into heaven - the final fulfillment of his mission.

These four sections are not random. Christ lived them for us - and they correspond to the four phases of Christian life - the phases by which we attain Christian maturity and wisdom. Knowing how things came about in our faith can really help us to see what direction **or path we are to take.** The 'Christian Life' for us has been shaped and publicized, now we are responsible for putting into action the way we live for Him.

KNIGHTS of COLUMBUS HOLY CROSS COUNCIL #9642 BASKETBALL FREE THROW CHAMPIONSHIP CONTEST



All boys and girls ages 9 to 14 (as of January 1, 2020) are invited to participate in the Knights of Columbus Holy Cross Council #9642 Free Throw Championship. This local level competition will be held Sunday, January 19, 2020 at the Trinity Elementary School gym, located at 2811 7th St East, West Fargo, ND. Practice and registration is from 12:30 PM to 1:00 PM. The competition starts promptly at 1:00 PM and typically is completed in about an hour. Basketballs will be furnished but you may bring your own. There is no charge to participate in this event. Boys and girls ages 9 through 11 may shoot 12 feet from the basket or from the 15-foot regulation foul line. Boys and girls ages 12 through 14 must shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet from the basket. **Boys ages 12 through 14 must use a men's regulation-size basketball, all others may use a women's regulation-size basketball.** Each contestant will receive 3 warm-up tosses followed by 15 consecutive free throw attempts. Ties are settled with a second round of 5 free throws with no warm-up tosses. Normal rules of basketball apply; contestants may not step on or over the line prior to the ball reaching the rim or bouncing off the backboard or out of bounds area. Awards will be given to all first place winners and certificates of participation and patches will be given to all participants. Winners will advance to the District competition with the chance to move on to the Regional, State and International levels. All participants are asked to bring a parent or guardian to sign the registration form and verify proof of age. First place winners will be required to furnish proof of age before advancing to the District competition.
