You are invited to a Listening Session on January 22nd

The Diocese of Fargo is preparing for a synod. It is a two-year process that began last year and will end in 2024. The last diocesan synod was held in over 70 years. The goal of the synod to develop a diocesan pastoral plan to serve the needs of our diocese. You are asked to participate by offering your thoughts and comments at a Listening Session. 15 Listening Sessions will be held throughout the diocese in January through March.

Bishop Folda will be present at the all the Listening Sessions. It will begin with Adoration, reflection on Scripture and Prayer. Your participation is valued in this

process.

One of the 15 Listening Sessions will be held here at Holy Cross next Sunday, January 22nd from 2:00 to 4:30 PM. We hope you can join us. There are some reflection bullet points for you to reflect on as you prepare for the Listening Session.

We invite you to share your thoughts on the following:

- To gage where the faith of the Church is at in the Diocese of Fargo.
- To Help the faithful reflect upon where they are at and where they could be.
- To Begin the discussion about what the next steps are to help get us where the Holy Spirit wants us to he.
- At our January 22nd Listening Session, we will be asked to reflect and discuss a few key questions:
- What are the top three things that are working well at your parish/diocese?
- What are the top three challenges to address in your parish/diocese?
- What is one step I might be called to take to respond?
