# A Message from Father



The Miracle at the Well

Today's inspiring passage from the Gospel of John, (4.5-42) is about the Samaritan woman at the well. It is so striking that Jesus would be in Samaria. Samaritans and Jews were enemies. Jews would travel extra miles to avoid Samaria. They had nothing to do with each other!

Moreover, Jews would not be speaking to women in public. In today's passage, Jesus asks the Samaritan woman for a drink of water at the well. She is shocked. They have a conversation that reveals how much Jesus knew about her even before He met her. She realizes that Jesus must be "the Christ."

Jesus tells her that if she followed Him, she would never thirst again. It was a miracle at the well.

It reminds me of another miracle at the well. Are you familiar with the story of Helen Keller? She was deaf, blind and mute. She lost her hearing and sight at the age of  $1 \frac{1}{2}$  years old. As she grew, she was like a wild animal. There was no way to communicate with her or to teach her.

Annie Sullivan was hired in 1887 to be Helen's private teacher. Annie's first step was to establish communication with her. The breakthrough finally came several weeks later. Annie and Helen walked down a path to the well-house. The teacher placed her hand under a spout of cool, gushing water. Annie spelled the word "w-a-t-e-r." Helen understood! It was a breakthrough. Helen understood that everything had a name to it. She hungered to learn more and more. Annie used water to communicate a message. So did Jesus at the well. Helen's life changed forever. A miracle at the well.

Helen graduated from college with honors and became a widely acclaimed author. She was a guest of every American president from Grover Cleveland to John F Kennedy.

Each year at the Easter Vigil, we gather around a "well." We bless water in a large baptismal font. Water is the source of life. Jesus is the source of life. Baptism changes us forever.

Both stories are very touching. What does this mean for us? We are to follow Jesus' example: invite people to the well. We all know of loved ones or acquaintances that do not come to Mass. Statistics show that 2/3rds of all Catholics who eventually return to the church is because they were invited by a friend or relative. We can plant seeds for another miracle to happen.

This Season of Lent would be a wonderful time to invite people to join us at Mass. Jesus tells us that there is more joy in Heaven over one person that has strayed and returned than the one hundred that have not strayed.

Let us pray the miracle to happen.


