A Message from Father



The Blind Man Sees; Those Who See are Blind!

Today's Gospel passage (John 9.1-41) is fascinating! Jesus heals a man that was blind from birth. The blind man is now able to see.

The Pharisees question the blind man and how he is able to see. They even doubt that he was ever blind. They asked his parents about the blind man. The parents testify that their son was blind from birth. But the interrogation continues. The Pharisees say that the one who cured him could not be from God because the miracle happened on the Sabbath.

Isn't it interesting that a miracle took place and the Pharisees didn't acknowledge it? They did not rejoice to see a man born blind from birth is cured and can see! They did not see God at work at all. Who was really blind?

"... Jesus said,

"I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind."

Some of the Pharisees who were with him heard this and said to him, "Surely we are not also blind, are we?" Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you are saying, 'We see,' so your sin remains..."

At times, are we blind? At first, the blind man thought of Jesus as a remarkable man. He came to the awareness that He is a prophet. The blind man returned to talk to Jesus. He realized that Jesus is more than a prophet. He fell to his knees. His faith grew because of his relationship with Jesus. The blind man was healed of his blindness physically but also spiritually.

Jesus is also there for us to cure what is blind in ourselves. Our relationship with Him through the Church and the Sacraments are the way we heal and are cured of our blindness.

The more we learn about Jesus Christ, the more we realize how glorious He is. This Season of Lent is a wonderful time to experience the glory of Christ.






