### A Message from Father



### Two Lessons to be Learned

Today's Gospel (Matthew 14.22-33) is about Jesus walking on the water. After Jesus fed the people, He told the disciples to get into a boat and go to the other side, while He dismissed the crowds. Then Jesus went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. He spent much time in prayer.

It was evening. The boat with the disciples was a few miles offshore. Strong winds were creating waves on the water that caused the boat to rock. Jesus walked on the water towards them. The disciples were frightened. Was it a ghost?

Jesus told them to have courage and said, "...it is I; do not be afraid." Peter said if it was Him, that Jesus command him to come to Jesus on the water. Jesus said, "Come."

Miraculously, Peter was able to walk on the water towards Jesus! But Peter saw that the winds were strong and became frightened. He started to sink. He called out, "Lord, save me!" Jesus rescued him and asked why he doubted.

What are the two lessons to be learned?

1st Lesson: Have faith! How many times have we thought that something we want to accomplish is next to impossible? Trusting in God and having a deep faith can make all the difference in the world. When I was asked to consider being a priest, I thought that it was impossible. It took faith and trust. Doors opened and Christ led the way.

and Lesson: Keeping our eyes on the goal. When Peter was walking on the water, he had his eyes fixed on Jesus. He was able to do it. The powerful winds overwhelmed Peter. He doubted and sank. He cried for help. Christ stretched out His hand and saved him. When we doubt or take our eyes off Jesus, we fall and sink.

To sum it up: to follow Jesus across the stormy sea of today's world, we must keep our eyes firmly fixed on Him. To keep our eyes on Him means that we turn to Christ in prayer. We need to constantly stay connected.




### PRAYER BLANKET MINISTRY LEADER NEEDED


