A Message from Father



Thank You!

This past month seemed to pass by so quickly! At the end of September, I was making preparations for our October 2-12th trip to the Holy Land.

The week before the trip, I spent time with my family as we came together for the September 28th funeral for my oldest brother, Douglas Ackerman, who died at the age of 77 on his birthday, September 22nd.

Before we knew it, it was time for our tour group to board two commercial buses to the Twin Cities for our flights to the Holy Land. Our group of 84 arrived in Tel Aviv Israel on Tuesday, October 3rd. Half of our group missed the first day of the tour because of a flight delay. Our group spent 4 nights in

Nazareth.

We were so excited to see Cana, the sight of Jesus' first miracle. We had Mass at the Church of the Annunciation, the site where the Angel Gabriel announced to Mary that she would bear the Savior of the world. We proceeded to Mount Tabor where Jesus was transfigured as Peter, James and John witnessed this overwhelming experience of faith.

On Thursday and Friday, October 5 & 6, the tour continued as scheduled. However, on Saturday, October 7th, things changed. We didn't know that war broke out in Gaza. Checkpoints throughout the country were being closed. We were not able to go to the Dead Sea, Jericho or the Jordan River. We traveled to our hotel in Bethlehem. Fortunately, even though the conflict was 45 miles away from us, we were able to do some touring in the Bethlehem area on Saturday and Sunday, October 7 & 8.

The war was escalating. On Monday, October 9th, we were told to remain in our hotels and not to leave the buildings. We were told that we were safe there. Checkpoints were closed. Miraculously, the checkpoint to Jerusalem opened! We were able to go to the Old City of Jerusalem and walk the Way of the Cross. We went to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher where we saw the burial place of Jesus. We were so grateful! After lunch nearby, we were told that the checkpoint between Jerusalem and Bethlehem would be closing. We returned to Bethlehem, a six mile trip.

We felt the Hand of God guiding us on our pilgrimage. We felt the power of prayer that was supporting us on our journey. Perpetual adoration began on Tuesday to Friday, October 10-13 at Holy Cross. People around the country and beyond were also praying for us.

The spirit of our group was good. However, I would think that they experienced anxiety during this time. I did. We were no longer interested in touring. We wanted to return home.

On Tuesday morning, October 10th, we were scheduled to meet to decide what to do. Our return flights were cancelled. Other flights from Tel Aviv would be full and unavailable for us. Our tour leader, Jane Alatrash, told us that we should pack our suitcases and travel to Jordan.

We traveled about 2 ½ hours to the Jordan border. We waited for 3 hours to cross into Jordan because of the long lines of tour buses and vehicles. At customs, we waited for about six hours. There were countless people that were also waiting to go through customs. We were happy. We were in Jordan. We were relieved. Our original buses and drivers could not enter Jordan. We had new buses waiting for us! We arrived in Amman, Jordan at an upscale American hotel about 10:30 PM. The manager of the hotel welcomed us as we entered the lobby and said to us, "Welcome to Jordan. You are safe." It was a welcome and an emotional encounter for us. There was a full dinner buffet waiting for us. We hadn't eaten all day.

Our next "hurdle" was to have flights arranged for 84 of us! A few left right away on Tuesday night. Another group of us left the next day, Wednesday, October 11th. There were 50 travelers who still needed flights. Tickets were booked for flights departing on Thursday and Friday, October 12th and 13th. The last of our travelers arrived safely to the US by Saturday, October 14th.

Our trip was a miracle! Thank you, to God who guided us! Thank you to all who prayed for us, all who helped us (family, friends, our Parish Staff, Trinity School, our US Senators, US Congressman, our Governor, US Department of State, US Embassy in Jerusalem, the media and other people that worked behind the scenes).

It was a powerful experience. It was a journey of faith! I am so grateful.




