A MESSAGE FROM FATHER



A Tribute to Fr Al Bitz

I suppose this article should be about the 1st Sunday of Advent. Today, we begin a new liturgical church year. We begin a new year filled with God's blessings.

But I am choosing to dedicate this article to Fr Al Bitz, a priest of our diocese who passed away on November 21st. His obituary said it this way: "... he entered the miracle of death on November 21, 2023."

Fr Bitz was an inspiration to so many. We were together in the same priest support group for 43 years. I will miss him dearly.

Fr Bitz worked hard to provide a better life for those in need.

He was concerned about the amount of food that had to be disposed of by grocery stores and restaurants. He contacted businesses to see if perishable food could be donated to a food bank. They responded by telling Fr Bitz that they would not want to be liable if there were problems with the food donated. He wouldn't stop there. Most would. I would have thought that nothing could be done. He worked with a couple of Protestant Pastors and went to the state legislature to have the law changed. The "Good Samaritan Law" was created. Daily Bread was formed. It is operated by Great Plains Food Bank. He served many years on the Daily Bread Board.

Fr Bitz was a 9 year member (3 terms) of the Friends of Chimbote Board of Directors. It is a faith-based organization dedicated to supporting programs that improve and transform the lives of the poor of Chimbote, Peru and surrounding communities.

Fr Bitz had a deep love for the beauty and dignity of the liturgies of the Church. He spent hours studying documents and implementing them into the spiritual life of the churches where he served.

Fr Bitz partnered with Catholic parishes and churches of other denominations to serve the needs of the homeless by collaborating with Churches United for the Homeless.

His generous spirit of charity for those in need was fostered in his rural home near Napoleon, ND. He had 15 brothers and sisters. They lived in a small home. When people were displaced or needed a place to live, his parents took them in and welcomed them.

Fr Bitz served on the Board of Directors for the University of Mary, Bismarck, ND. After his retirement, he moved to Bismarck and worked for three years in the Development Office at the University of Mary.

Fr Bitz lived the faith he deeply professed.

Building Project Update (from the Construction Meeting on November 22nd)

The top part of the steeple is in construction. When finished, a large crane will be on site to lift the 53,000 pound structure into place. A 3rd layer of insulation is being put on the roof of the church. The cross that will be placed at the top of the steeple will be stainless steel. The shop drawings for it are being reviewed. The interior of the church and gathering area are being insulated with spray foam. Work continues in the new office addition. The elevator for the church has been ordered.

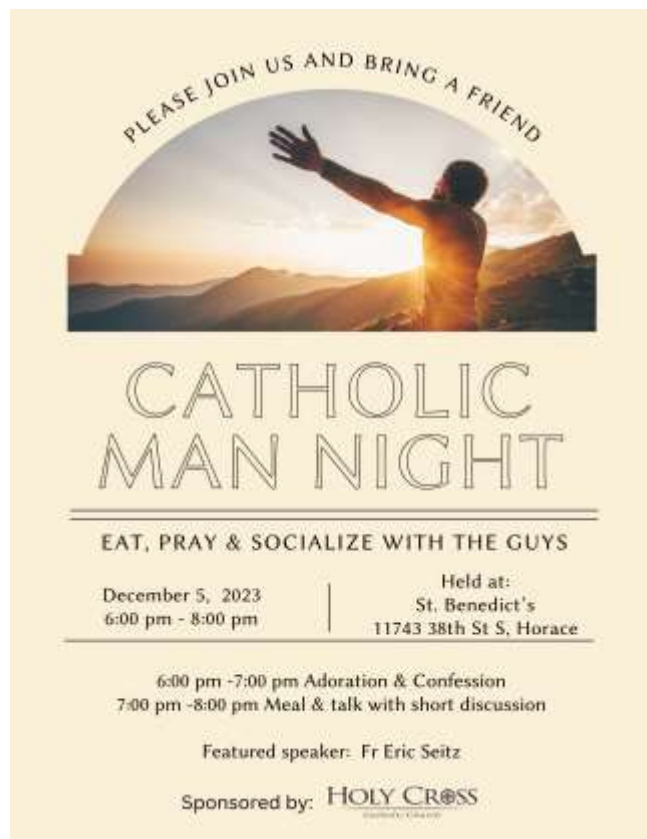

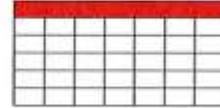
