A Message from Father



It's Catholic Schools Week!

This is the 50th Anniversary of celebrating National Catholic Schools Week. This year's theme is "Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community." We are so blessed to have Trinity Catholic School as a part of our parish. We are also blessed to have a Pre-K to 12th Grade Catholic School System in our community! Faith is a part of every aspect of our lives: at home, at school, at work and in all we do. Thank you to all who support our schools. It is a gift to our children and to all of us!

Unclean Spirits

Today's Gospel (Mark 1.21-28) tells us of a man with an unclean spirit interrupting Jesus as He spoke in a synagogue at the beginning of His ministry. People were spellbound by His teaching.

An unclean spirit arose to try to stop the work of Christ. It didn't work. Jesus cast the unclean spirit out of the man. The crowd was shocked at what Jesus had the power to do.

As sinners, all of us have some kind of unclean spirits, too. We struggle with things in our lives that should not be there. Christ is there to help us. He is our strength. We cannot do it on our own.

Maybe we find that something keeps us from praying; or preventing us from forgiving others; or being generous with what we have. We find ourselves spending a lot of time, energy and money on ourselves. How much do we devote to God and His Church? I was reading about an individual who said that he gives more in tips to waiters, waitresses and bartenders than he does to the Church on Sundays! He knows that isn't right.

Jesus wants to free us of what is keeping us from living the life He calls us to live.

Let us come before the Lord with humble hearts and ask Him to cast off that which keeps us from doing what we are called to do!

Building Project (Notes as of our January 17th Meeting)

Now that the steeple tower has been put into place, steps will be installed next week.

The current temperature in the new church is about 37-40 degrees.

The temporary construction wall in the main hallway was removed this week. A temporary insulated wall will be installed at the end of the new hallway to keep the office addition from being too cold.

Insulation will continue to be installed in the new church. A roofing company was on site last week working on all flat roofs. They have the high-flat roof watertight.

Insulation is being installed in the balcony, and side aisles sprayed, and will continue into the Transepts and Sanctuary this week. Installers are set to remain on site to spray until completed. They are to sequence their spraying east to west ahead of interior wall framing.

The coiling fire door is being installed today. It looks like a garage door and will only be used for protection from fires. This is a requirement of the city's building code.

Glass windows are being installed in the Gathering Space Area (church entrance). The elevator for the church was delivered this week and is stored in the Bus Barn. It will be installed this summer or later.






