#### A Message from Father

#### A Grain of Wheat

I grew up on a farm in rural Reynolds, ND, near Grand Forks. As a farmer, Dad loved raising wheat. It was his favorite crop. Harvest time seemed to be his favorite time of the year. He would take a small handful of wheat that was pouring out of the auger of the combine and put it in his mouth. He encouraged us kids to do the same. After chewing the hard kernels for a while, it turned into a gum-like substance. I looked forward to that ritual every year.

Wheat has a purpose. It is grown to be destroyed. Wheat is used as flour for bread and so many kinds of foods. As Jesus tells us in today's Gospel (John 12.20-33), wheat falls to the ground and dies. When it does, it produces much fruit.

Jesus goes on to say that if we try to hold on and focus only on our earthly lives, we lose eternal life. Our focus is to "die to self" so that we may live eternally.

A psychiatrist once said he discovered in his practice that long-term drug addicts have only two options available to them: one is death, and the other is God. He says that unless they manage to get religion — discover God in some way — they will continue to go downhill until, sadly, they reach the end of the road. However, this holds true for all of us. If we fail to recognize the presence of God in our lives, we are spiritually dead. Jesus invites us to live! He gives us what we need.

At the end of today's Gospel, Jesus is preparing His disciples for what will happen to Him. He will suffer and die on the Cross. Jesus embraced His Cross. As His followers, we are also called to embrace our crosses. In doing so, we bear much fruit. We become more spiritually alive!

This Season of Lent is an invitation, a path to deepen our faith through the three pillars of Lent: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving.

Our Lenten Reconciliation Service will be held on Tuesday, March 19<sup>th</sup>. 10 priests will be available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If this does not work in your schedule, a list of area Reconciliation Services are provided in this bulletin.

#### Church Building Project Update

Work is being done in the choir loft. Window frames for the stained glass windows will arrive later this month. Niches for the statues on the walls of the side wings will accommodate six-foot statues. Plans for lighting of the steeple tower are being reviewed. Hammer beams (wooden) have been stalled in the main body of the church. They are not supporting beams but are installed to enhance the design of the church. Work continues in the sacristy area and narthex (entrance area).
