Holy Week

This week is the most inspiring week of the year. Today, we carry palms as we hail Christ as He enters Jerusalem. We read the Passion and Suffering that Jesus endured on His way to the Cross. Jesus will complete the work of our redemption! He will rise in victory.

Chrism Mass

The priests, deacons, religious, seminarians and the faithful gather on Tuesday for the Chrism Mass. The priests will renew their promises to serve Christ and His Church. Bishop Folda will bless the new oils: Chrism, Oil of the Sick and Oil of Catechumens.

Holy Thursday

We commemorate the First Mass offered: Jesus Christ at the Last Supper as He broke bread and blessed wine to become His Body and Blood. He commands us to take and eat and to take and drink. This is the source of eternal life!

Good Friday

It's a very solemn day as we remember Christ as He carries His Cross and dies for us. It's so striking when Peter denies three times that he does not know Christ. I think about the times when we also denied Christ in our lives. Jesus dies to save us from our sinfulness.

Holy Saturday

The most profound liturgy of the year. The Roman Missal entitles this Mass as "the mother of all vigils." We bless the new fire, a symbol of Christ's light that illuminate the darkness that we experience. We read passages from the Scriptures. We welcome the newly baptized and confirmed.
