A Message from Father

Happy Easter!

On behalf of our Parish Staff and School Staff, we wish each and everyone a Happy and Blessed Easter!

The Lord has Risen! Alleluia! The Easter Vigil last night and today's celebration of Easter are the most important days of the Church year! Jesus Christ was born to save us and bring us new life!

We are given the Gift of Eternal Life! It is the most important gift of all. I was reading an article about a woman's experience of eternal life:

"A young woman is rushed to the hospital — she arrives unconscious — the traumatic shock has set in, and she is very near death. Emergency Room nurses struggle to find a pulse and cannot get a blood

pressure reading. Days later, remembering the experience, the patient said,

Within the tiniest fraction of an instant, I was out of my body and out of pain. I was up on the ceiling in the corner of the room, looking down, watching doctors and nurses rush around frantically as they tried to save my life. And then I began to feel the most incredible, warm, golden, loving feeling, which was also a wonderful, warm, golden light. I was in this light, part of this light. There was a presence in the light, a wisdom, and that wisdom was the final word. The wisdom loved me and, at the same time, knew everything about me. Everything I had ever done and felt was there for me to see. I wanted to proceed into the light and stay there forever, but I was shown that I had to go back and take care of my two children.

This experience has taught me three things. First, I know that death is not painful. I will never be afraid to die. Second, I know it's important to be true to myself and others because I will be accountable for my life when it's over. And third, I'm talking about eternity — something I will experience for all eternity."

Hearing about experiences like this gives us encouragement and hope. Jesus destroyed sin and death. Because of Him, we live forever! We are truly free.

Jesus is risen from the dead. Alleluia!

Church Building Project Update (as of the March 20th Meeting)

Exterior brick-laying project is tentatively set to resume on the 1st week of April, weather permitting. Cullen Insulation has completed spray foam in the church. They will spray foam exterior walls in the tower after framing and sheathing.

The Sacristy will be ready to be painted early-mid April.

FM Contracting had an additional crew on site last week hanging sheetrock in the Sacristy and Transepts. That crew will return today to frame and sheetrock soffits in the Sacristy and cover the rest of the foam in the Nave. FM completed framing and sheathing the front entry columns, and will have the tower up to 46 feet framed and sheathed by mid next week to stay ahead of Huesman-Schreiber

G & R Controls was on site to wire controls in the basement for the floor heat system. They began running conduits for thermostats ahead of sheetrock. They are working with All American to get sensors to control the floor heat system.



NEXT PERMANENT DIACONATE FORMATION CLASS




Father Meyer 30th Anniversary of Ordination
