and share in the benefits of your intercession of love.

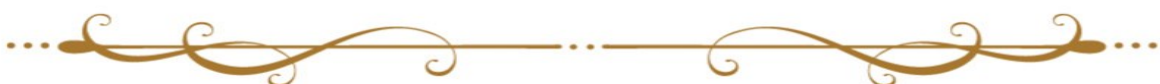
So that our consecration may be truly effective and persevering,

The Profession of Faith

Small housewares and electronics—dishes, glassware, utensils, toasters, blenders, coffee makers, radios, cd players etc.

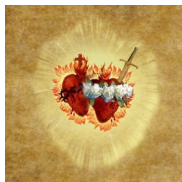

Baptism Program:

1. Make arrangements beforehand by calling the parish office. You can call before the baby is born.
2. Baptisms are usually held on the 2nd Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm.

Marriages:

1. Make arrangements beforehand by calling the parish office.
2. Diocesan policy requires that marriage preparation begin at least six months prior to the wedding.

Hospital Visitation:

Please inform the parish office if one of your family members is hospitalized at Good Samaritan Hospital, Elmhurst Hospital, or Central DuPage Hospital and you wish a priest to visit. Catholic chaplains are assigned to all hospitals to administer the Sacraments and care for the spiritual needs of patients. Kindly inform the information desk.

Notification of the Death of a Parishioner:

Upon the death of a parishioner and once final arrangements have been made, details will be announced at the next scheduled morning Mass. The parish office will also post the information on the bulletin board in the walkway between the church and school.
