

CHRISTMAS DAY

Dear friend in Jesus Christ, Merry Christmas to you all!!!

As I have been reminding you throughout advent. Jesus is the biggest gift that the world ever received, and I He is the gift that we ever can have in our personal life. And our hearts are the best gift. On this great celebration of Christmas, we recall Jesus being constricted for love of us: Jesus, Son of God and Eternal Word of God, Whom the universe cannot contain, is constricted in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Jesus, through whom all things came into being, accepts the constraints and limitations of a human body.



After birth, Jesus was "wrapped in swaddling clothes". These clothes encircled His body, constricting Him. The Baby Jesus was hunted down by the government. His family fled to Egypt. He was constricted through life as a Refugee in a land far from His home. Jesus was constricted on the cross, the Almighty God pressed to its wood by a few nails. Jesus was constricted again by swaddling clothes. His burial cloths were wrapped around His immobile body. After dying, the body of Jesus was constricted in a tomb. Why did Jesus submit to these constrictions for our sake? Because He is love, "God is Love", and love endures all things.

Have you heard the news today - the "good news" of Jesus Christ, the Son of God and son of Mary who was born for us in Bethlehem. He is born on earth to tell us how much He loves us. Family and friends, the birth of Christ, is it still good news to us? Jesus, as our Savior, brought the "Good News" that our God is a loving, forgiving, merciful, rewarding God and not a judgmental, cruel, punishing God. He demonstrated by His life and teaching how God our Heavenly Father loves us, forgives us, provides for us, and rewards us. All His miracles were signs of this Divine Love. Jesus' final demonstration of God's love for us was His death on the cross to atone for our sins and to make us children of God. Each Christmas reminds us that sharing love with others is our Christian privilege and duty, and every time we do that, Jesus is reborn in our lives. Let us humbly admit the truth with the German mystic Angelus

Silesius "Christ could be born a thousand times in Bethlehem

- but all in vain until He is born in me."

Hence, let us allow Jesus to be reborn in our hearts and lives, not only during Christmas, but every day, so that He may radiate the Light of His presence from within us as sharing and selfless love, expressed in compassionate words and deeds, unconditional forgiveness, the spirit of humble service and, overflowing generosity.

So, let us allow Him to be reborn in our lives during Christmas 2022 and every day of the New Year 2023. How should we prepare for Christ's rebirth in our daily lives? As a first step, John the Baptist urges us to repent daily of our sins and to renew our lives by leveling the hills of pride and selfishness, filling up the valleys of impurity, and by straightening the crooked paths of hatred. Our second step in preparing for Christ's rebirth in our daily lives is to cultivate the spirit of sacrifice and humility. It was by sacrifice that the shepherds of Bethlehem and the Magi were able to find the Savior. They were humble enough to see God in the Child in the manger. We, too, can experience Jesus by sharing Him with others, just as God shared His Son with us. Let us remember that the angels wished peace on earth only to those able to receive that peace, those who possessed the goodwill and largeness of heart to share Jesus our Savior with others in love, kindness, mercy, forgiveness, and humble service. MERRY CHRISTMAS to you all!!

Registration ~ Are you new to the area or new to the Catholic Community of St. James? If yes, registration is simple. You may register on our website www.stjamesonline.org or call our Parish Office ext.100. Upon registration, we will need a copy of all your sacramental records. Also, we receive many requests for testimonial letters, sponsorship forms for the Sacraments, letters of recommendation or character references. In order to accommodate you, you must be a registered and active parishioner for 6 months and also supply a baptismal certificate. Please contact the Parish Office at 732-634-0500 ext. 100. For those who have reached the age of 22 and work full time, please register as an individual.

Baptisms ~ Baptisms are celebrated every Sunday of the month at 1:15pm. Parents are required to attend a pre-baptism session first. Please call the parish office at 732-634-0500 ext. 100 for more information. If you would like to request a Baptism Class or Baptism in Spanish, please call the parish office 732-634-0500 ext. 100. Si desea solicitor una clase de bautismo o de bautismo en español por favor póngase en contacto 732-634-0500. After the baptism class, and when Godparents' sponsor certificates are provided, you may schedule a baptism, please call 732-634-0500 ext. 100.

Qualifications for Godparents and Confirmation Sponsors ~ Must be at least 14 years of age, having received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.

Must be an active Catholic: someone who is registered in a Catholic parish, attends Mass, contributes to the support of the church, in a valid Catholic marriage, and publicly leads a life compatible with church teaching. We can only write letters of eligibility for parishioners who meet these criteria.

These requirements are the <u>universal law</u> of the Church, and are not determined by the individual parish.

Marriages ~ Ideally, registered parishioners of St. James are welcome to make arrangements at least one year in advance. Please contact Cathy at the Parish Office ext. 100, immediately after your engagement to schedule an appointment to speak with a priest or deacon in order to secure a date. The date with the church must be confirmed before making other social plans. Wedding times - Weekday afternoon - Saturday 1:30pm. Sunday 2:30pm.

To Become a Roman Catholic....

R.C.I.A. ~ The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is the process by which we prepare non-Catholics who are interested in becoming members of the Roman Catholic Church, and Catholics who wish to complete their initiation sacraments. For information please call Deacon Roel Mercado at 732-738-4106.

Ministry To The Sick And Dying ~ We minister to those who are ill, in local hospitals or homebound, especially to those in hospice care. Please call 732-634-0500 and press 1. Anointing of the infirmed is an opportunity to pray for healing. If you are going for surgery or a test ask the priest after Mass or call the Parish Office.





The Seventy-fourth in a Series

"The Vocation and Mission of the Lay Faithful in the Church and in the World"

The last article concluded by summarizing the three offices of Christ that the whole People of God participate in (Priest, Prophet, and King) through Baptism and that they bear responsibilities for the mission and service that flow from them. (An example of the kingly mission of the lay faithful was given to a family at mealtime.) Because the lay faithful belong to Christ, Lord, and King of the Universe, they share in his kingly mission and are called by him to spread that Kingdom in history. Above all it is exercised in the spiritual combat in which they seek to overcome the kingdom of sin – "Therefore, sin must not 'reign' in your mortal bodies so that you obey their desires." (cf. Rom 6:12); ..." What, indeed, is as 'royal' for a soul as to govern the body in obedience to God..." (St. Leo the Great, Sermo 4). It is a combat found in Christ who exercises his kingship through his death and resurrection that draws all to himself. And they are to make a gift of themselves so as to serve in justice and charity, Jesus, who is present in all his brothers and sisters, above all in the very least (cf. Mt. 25:40). For Christ, King, and Lord of the universe, made himself the servant of all, for he came "not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mt 20:28). For the Christian "to "reign" is to serve him," particularly when serving the poor and suffering, in whom the Church recognizes her poor and suffering founder. In them, the Church strives to serve Christ. "The People of God fulfills its royal duty by a life in keeping with its vocation to serve with Christ" (CCC 786).

In the mercy we show to others we remind each other that no matter what we look like, no matter what our station in life is, and no matter what we have done, we are sacred and precious in God's sight.

On the evening of the opening of the Second Vatican Council (October 11, 1962) when Pope John XXIII was asked to address the faithful outside, he was at a loss for words, then he said, "When you go back home, you will find your children, give them a hug and say, "This is a hug from the pope." It was a departure from formal papal words of the past but it **became a graphic image of the Church of Tenderness**. Going inside he said, "I didn't know what to say, I turned to my Teresina [my "little Therese"] – St. Theresa of Lisieux!

FINANCIAL COMMITTEE




