TICKET ALLOCATION FOR CHRISTMAS EVE / CHRISTMAS DAY

I am delighted to say that since the introduction of the 'Season Ticket Scheme' the number of parishioners attending Mass has increased to near capacity with 353 seats taken from a maximum of 400. The dilemma I have been pondering these past weeks is how to accommodate this number of parishioners in six Masses for the celebration of the Lord's birth. Masses on Christmas Eve will be celebrated at 4pm, 5,30pm and 7pm. Masses on Christmas Day will be celebrated at 9.30am, 11am and 12.30pm. Sadly, and regrettably, there will be disappointment for many families who will be unable to attend Mass on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

I have been in discussion with the Parish Pastoral Council, together we agreed a system we consider fair, open and just. The approach to allocation of tickets is as follows:

- Each season ticket holder will be invited to apply for a ticket to the Mass of their choosing in the order of their preference.
- The application will require the person's name, the Mass they attend each week and their seat number.
- Only those persons named on the Registration Form will be eligible for a seat.
- Applications will not be accepted after the cut-off date of SUNDAY 13TH DECEMBER AT MIDNIGHT.
- Applications should be placed in the A5 envelope provided, sealed and returned before the cut-off date.
- Applications will be placed in a sack and opened randomly by myself and two members of the Parish Pastoral Council on an agreed date after the 13th December to ensure transparency and fairness.
- Successful applicants will receive their Christmas ticket beginning Wednesday 16th December when they arrive for Mass.
- Unsuccessful applicants will be notified.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation. Whatever the outcome, please know that my Masses on Christmas Day will be offered for all families in the parish.
