

*CHRISTMAS OCTAVE:

For Catholics Christmas is not just 25 December but the Church's liturgy extends it over an Octave of eight days that prolong the solemnity of Christmas Day. The Christmas Octave lasts from Christmas Day until 1 January when we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Every day within the octave is treated the same as the original feast day of the Nativity of our Lord. So, we would encourage you during Covid restrictions to book to come to Mass on any of those days, knowing that you are truly still celebrating Christmas Day.

The Christmas Season begins with Evening Prayer on Christmas Eve (December 24) and ends with Evening Prayer on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (January 10, 2021).

Tier 4 – Mass Allocation for Season Ticket Holders

On Saturday 19th December, the First Minister announced that all of mainland Scotland will move to Tier 4 restrictions from one minute after Midnight on the morning of the 26th December 2020. These restrictions will be in place initially for three weeks.

As Church, it means that we are only permitted a maximum of twenty people at any one Mass. A small number of parishioners will be allocated two Masses but the majority will only be eligible for one Mass during the period of Tier 4.
