My Brothers and Sisters,

I was delighted to hear the First Minister announce on Tuesday that places of worship can resume services from Friday 26 March, the day before the start of the Holy Week. Unfortunately, there is insufficient time to manage allocation of seats for the Masses and Services scheduled for Holy Week. I have considered a number of options and concluded that there is no easy solution that will please everyone. My hope is that you will understand the decision I have taken and appreciate that this is the fairest way of allocating seats.

**FOR HOLY WEEK ONLY**, seats will be allocated on a first come basis for all Masses and Services on the understanding that the maximum number of bodies in the church will be 50. **The Season Ticket Scheme will resume the week beginning Monday 5<sup>th</sup> April** and remain in place until the end of the pandemic.

The demand for Season Tickets I am pleased to say is on the increase. It's reassuring to know that many more parishioners wish to return to church. At present we are operating a waiting list for seats. May I remind ticket holders that tickets were granted on the understanding that the seat would be used **each week**, and if you were unable to use your ticket you would **let me know at least the day before**, so that others might be able to use the seat. If your circumstances have changed, and you no longer wish to use your seat each week, please let me know.

**Holy Thursday** Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7pm, followed by Night Prayer at 9pm.

**The Good Friday** Solemn Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Death at 3pm. Evening Service: A Reflection on the Way of the Cross, with Veneration of the Cross and a Communion Rite, at 7pm.

**The Solemn Vigil** of the Lord's Resurrection at 8.30pm.

**Easter Sunday** at 10am.

I look forward to celebrating with you the liturgies of Holy Week commemorating the final days of the Lord's ministry from his entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, through the pain and suffering of Good Friday, to the day of his glorious resurrection. I will pray for you and your loved ones throughout this great week.

**\*SCIAF & Papal & Episcopal & St. Mirin's Fund - 14 March 2021** The proceeds of this collection are divided 75% to SCIAF and 25% to our new St Mirin's Fund. SCIAF is the official aid and international development charity of the Catholic Church in Scotland. It works in sixteen countries across Asia, Africa and Latin America to help the poorest in the world, regardless of religion, to work their way out of poverty. The St. Mirin's Fund awards small grants for good causes that promote the Kingdom of God among us, with special consideration to: children and young people, the elderly, those with disabilities and special needs, or suffering from poverty, mental illness, homelessness or refugees. In 2018 this collection raised £28,013, which represents 110% of our expenditure of £25,389 resulting in a small fund surplus of £2,624. The Papal & Episcopal Fund also contributed £15,000 from reserves to the SPRED Fund.

Pope Francis, through the Pontifical Council for the promotion of the New Evangelisation, will officially recognise the unique status of Knock as an **International Marian and Eucharistic Shrine** on **March 19, the Feast of St Joseph.**

**Pope Francis will deliver a special message via video link** recognising Knock Shrine as an International Marian and Eucharistic Shrine during Mass at 7.30 p.m. on Friday, March 19. The Mass will be celebrated by Most Rev. Michael Neary, Archbishop of Tuam and concelebrated by Fr. Richard Gibbons, PP and Rector of Knock Shrine.

Unique to the Apparition at Knock is the representation of the Eucharist as the risen Lord which appeared as the Lamb on the altar, standing before his Cross and surrounded by a host of angels. The completely unique nature of the Apparition scene is something that has fascinated and inspired people for generations..

As part of the three days of celebration to St. Joseph, **Pope Francis will speak at**

**the 7.30 p.m. Mass on March 19;** Cardinal Christoph Schönborn, Archbishop of Vienna, will speak at the 7.30 p.m. Mass on March 20, and concluding the three days, Archbishop Michael Neary, Archbishop of Tuam will speak at 12 p.m. Mass on Sunday, March 21. **The Triduum will be streamed live on the Knock Shrine website [www.knockshrine.ie](http://www.knockshrine.ie) and on Facebook @knockshrine on Friday, March 19, at 7.30 p.m., Saturday, March 20, at 7.30 p.m. and concluding on Sunday, March 21, at 12 noon.**

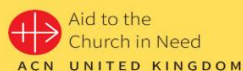
