Due to Tier 4 restrictions our 2021 Lenten 40 DAYS FOR LIFE peaceful prayer and fasting vigil at the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital in Glasgow was postponed. Sadly, in the midst of this current situation the government did not halt or restrict its abortion culture of death.

On March 23rd 2021 the government called for a UK National Day of Reflection to be held for those who had died from Covid the previous year. According to latest official figures at that time there had been 143,259 Covid deaths. The following month April 2021 we marked the 53rd anniversary of the implementation of the 1967 Abortion Act which has resulted in almost 9.5million deaths of our

unborn children here in the UK. Think of the unborn when you pray the words 'For what I have done and for what I have failed to do'. Think of those words in the ballot box. 'They will not grow old as we who are left grow old but we will remember them.' St. Cadoc's Parish has always supported 40 DAYS FOR LIFE, the prayer and fasting vigil which usually takes place in Lent each year at the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital. It was not possible in Lent this year for obvious reasons. Lasty year's vigil was also cut short. As a result a "20 DAYS FOR LIFE" vigil is being planned for June this year at the QEUH site. It starts on 1 June 2021 at 8 am. This is the feast of Mary, Mother of the Church. It will run from 8am until 8 pm each day and will finish at 8pm on 20 June.

If you are able to support this venture and perhaps take a weekly slot please let Lesley Ward know (lesley@giffnockwards.co.uk or 07910266821). The parish have usually given support on a Sunday over the last 5 years but participants are needed for every day this year, including Sunday.





Each year the Abbot and Community of Pluscarden Abbey sponsor a series of four lectures by an invited Theologian on an aspect of Catholic Theology. The Lectures are held on the Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday after Pentecost in St Scholastica's Retreat House at the Abbey. They are open to all.



Fr Thomas Joseph White is a Dominican priest, who lives and teaches at the Pontifical University of St Thomas (Angelicum) in Rome, where he is the Director of the Thomistic Institute. Originally a native of south-eastern Georgia (USA), Fr White studied at Brown University. He converted to Catholicism in his senior year, influenced by reading Flannery O'Connor, Aristotle, Newman, von Balthasar and John Paul II. He did his doctoral studies at Oxford University where his research focused on Aquinas' metaphysics and arguments for the existence of God.


Fr White is the author of various books and articles including Wisdom in the Face of Modernity, A Thomistic Study in Natural Theology (Sapientia Press, 2009, second edition 2016), The Incarnate Lord, A Thomistic Study in Christology (The Catholic University of America Press, 2015), Exodus (Brazos Press, 2016), The Light of Christ: An Introduction to Catholicism (The Catholic


University of America Press, 2017), and The Trinity: On the Nature and Mystery of the One God (forthcoming from The Catholic University of America Press).

With Matthew Levering he is the co-editor of the academic journal Nova et Vetera. In 2011 he was appointed an ordinary member of the Pontifical Academy of St. Thomas Aquinas and in 2019 was named a Distinguished Scholar of the McDonald Agape Foundation. He held the 2018-2019 McInnes Chair for theological inquiry at the Angelicum.

If, as seems likely, it is not possible to host this year's Lectures at the Abbey, they will be live streamed, probably direct from Rome. Please check the website regularly for any updates. It is planned to have recordings available via the website for those who cannot tune in at the appropriate times.
