## 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

Groundbreaking for Our Lady of Lourdes, Ada was September 10, 1874. Dedication Mass was December 8, 1874 with Rev. A. M. Quatman, Rev. Anthony S. Siebenfoercher, and Rev Homan officiating. The original 30x50' structure was from the current back interior wall to the front step in front of the current altar area. The sacristy area was added in 1954, and the adjoining parish hall was added in 1974. The original cost of the building was \$3227.50, which included the land, altar, pews and bell.

In 2024 we will be celebrating the anniversary of OLL with many activities throughout the year leading to the December 8<sup>th</sup> anniversary. If you would like to be on the planning committee, please email the office.
