On Friday, June 26, Fr. Andy was a guest cook on *KDTH AM 1370* with Michael Kaye for his "*Cookin' with Kaye*" segment. Michael enjoyed the smoked ribs, so we thought we'd share the varieties and the recipe.

### **Type and Style:**

- 1. Baby Back Ribs -Dry Rub: Corky's
- 2. Baby Back Ribs Dry Rub: The Squeal
- 3. St. Louis Ribs Dry Rub: The Squeal; Sauce: Cremer's Homemade BBQ
- 4. St. Louis Ribs Dry Rub: The Squeal; Sauce: Pine Ridge Sweet Jalapeno BBQ
- 5. St. Louis Ribs Dry Rub: The Squeal; Sauce: Korean BBO

#### **Directions:**

Remove the thin layer of membrane from the bottom, concave side of the ribs. Apply the seasoning rub on the grill, moderate coat. Smoke for 3-4 Hours at 225 until they have a sufficiently dark appearance. Apply sauce if desired. Wrap in tin foil. Cook for 1-2 more hours at 250 degrees until warmed sufficiently or sauce has caramelized.

#### Smoker used:

Pit Boss brand, sold at Theisen's, 1000 cubic inches will hold 7 racks of ribs comfortably, more if creative.

#### Pellets used:

Competition Blend found at Theisen's.

As for me, in justice I shall behold your face; I shall be filled with the vision of your glory.

First Reading: Isaiah 55:10-11

Thus says the LORD: Just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there till they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful, giving seed to the one who sows and bread to the one who eats, so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; my word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it.

### Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 65

R. The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest. You have crowned the year with your bounty, and your paths overflow with a rich harvest; The untilled meadows overflow with it, and rejoicing clothes the hills.

#### Second Reading: Romans 8:18-23

I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us.

For creation awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of God; for creation was made subject to futility, not of its own accord but because of the one who subjected it, in hope that creation itself would be set free from slavery to corruption and share in the glorious freedom of the children of God. We know that all creation is groaning in labor pains even until now; and not only that, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, we also groan within ourselves as we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies.

#### Gospel: Matthew 13:1-23

"Hear then the parable of the sower. The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart. The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a time. When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away. The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word, but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit. But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."


