From the Pastor

Our Gospel this weekend is the beginning of the most famous sermon ever preached, the Sermon on the Mount, which is really the guide to how to live life as a Christian. The first thing Jesus talked about was these Beatitudes, we often think of them as "blessings," but the Greek word being translated as blessing here is actually *makarios*, which literally means "happy." So when you read the Beatitudes it's not just a list of blessings, it's actually a description of how to be happy, it's the secret of happiness. It is the heart of Jesus' preaching (CCC 1716). Everyone, every single human being created, desires happiness, seeks after happiness, and these Beatitudes gives us the blueprint.

Now these are strange statements about how to be happy, and I don't have time to go through them all, but I'd encourage every Christian to recognize the value of each of these and to work towards growth in every area. These are things to aspire to, with no upper limit. When God gave Moses the Ten Commandments, Moses gave them to the people at the bottom of Mt. Sinai, but when God gave the people the Beatitudes, He gave it to them from the top of the mountain, showing we can go up, we should seek something higher. And if they don't make sense, do some research, they are so much deeper and richer than we give them credit for. May God bless you as you seek to live these beatitudes in a deeper way, growing in true happiness. - Fr. Andy




