

Pastor's Corner...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Confirmation: This weekend is a time of great grace for us at Blessed Sacrament Church as we welcome Bishop Frederick Campbell. Bishop Campbell is a successor of the apostles who shepherds the Church in the 23 Counties of the Diocese of Columbus.

This is a weekend of great grace as our young people will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. We call them "Confirmands." This literally means "Those needing to be strengthened." Our young people preparing for Confirmation are "needing to be strengthened" by the Holy Spirit. As they enter into their adolescent years, already difficult enough, they are doing so in a culture that is increasingly more secular, confused, and hostile to the values of our faith. Given the pervasive influence of our culture through television, radio, magazines, Internet, social media, music, video games, etc., it is no surprise that they are deeply influenced by this culture. They need, we all need, the Gift of the Holy Spirit to discern what is true, good, and beautiful in this culture and to reject what is false, evil, and ugly. They need, we all need, the Gift of the Holy Spirit to have the strength to speak the truth, choose the good, and live according to the beauty that is the will of God for us. These young people will emerge as adults in an America that is increasingly foreign to the America I grew up in. Just one generation ago, there was a cultural assumption of Christianity and Christian values. Now, Christians are increasingly outsiders. These young people will be called to be witnesses to Christ to a generation that will be the most ignorant on matters of Christian faith than any previous generation in our nation's history. They may be called to give heroic witness. They need our prayers. They need our witness. The good news is that through the Gift of the Holy Spirit given at Confirmation they will have, all the Confirmed have, the necessary strength to be a light, to live the faith, and to bring the love of Christ to others. I pray that their Confirmation brings a grace of renewal to all of us. May all of us rely in a deeper way on the Gift of the Holy Spirit.

Restoration Update: For the past six months or so, I have been meeting regularly with the Architect, General Contractors, and Superintendent of Buildings for the Diocese of Columbus. During these months, we have made steady progress in identifying what we would like to do and how much it will cost. We have also engaged in the difficult work of selecting what we want to do now, where we have to cut back, and what will have to be postponed. We are in the final stages of finalizing the details of the budget.

Along with these meetings, I have also been meeting regularly with a group of six parishioners (3 men and 3 women) of varying ages and backgrounds to offer parishioner input on the various decisions we have to make. There has been a surprising amount of peace in this process which I attribute to the prayers of our parishioners. We are steadily working towards a start date of April 11th with a goal of completion by Christmas of 2016.

I wish to extend my gratitude to all parishioners who have made a pledge and continue to make payments on your pledges. For those who have not made a pledge, the campaign remains "open" as there are always more ways we can expand and improve upon our project. For those in a

financial position to pay off your pledge early, I also ask you to consider that. Early pay-off will help our project in three ways: It will help us to reach the 50% cash on hand we need to begin the 1.2 million dollar project, it will lower the cost associated with the "redemption" phase of our campaign, and it will reduce the interest we will owe on the short-term loan we will need to take out to begin the project.

Funeral Plans: November is a great month to ponder the last things. As we have celebrated All Saints and prayed for All Souls, we are also confronted with our own mortality. Are your affairs in order? Do you have a will? Do you have a Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care Decisions (and not a "Living Will" which is really a "Death Will")? Have you informed your family of your wishes to have a funeral Mass? Have you prayerfully considered leaving 10% of your estate to the parish and to charity? Have you informed your family of your wishes to have a priest called if you are gravely ill? With more and more adult children choosing not to practice the Catholic faith, it is more important that you express your wishes to your family. I am always saddened when a lifelong practicing Catholic does not have a funeral Mass because their children don't see the value or don't want to be uncomfortable. In our tradition, the funeral Mass is primarily for the deceased and secondarily for the mourners. The greatest thing we can do for our deceased loved ones is to offer a Mass for them. Please make sure that those who will be making your final arrangements know of your desire to have a funeral Mass.

Missing Parishioners: Have you noticed a parishioner who has not recently been at Mass? Has someone you know "disappeared" from regular attendance at Mass? The responsibility to be a community rests on all of our shoulders. I am asking you to call those who you haven't seen and reach out to those who have "disappeared." Sometimes we just need to know that someone cares. When someone notices our absences, misses us, and lets us know, it can make all the difference. If you become aware of a parishioner who has experienced difficulties and is in need of my pastoral care, please let me know. We are all called to share in the shepherding ministry of Christ.

The developing baby is now called a “fetus,” which is Latin for “little one.” She is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month, baby teeth form, and fingers and toes are developing. Her ears, nose, lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning, and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks, all body systems are present. This little one is now jumping, flipping, and turning – her first dance steps!
