

Spiritual Adoption Month 4 "I had a dream!"

The baby's brain has begun maturing – a process that will continue until she is about 14 years old. Her eyelids are now sealed shut and will re-open at 7 months. Her taste buds are now working. Nutrients consumed by her mother are passed on to her in an hour or two. Three hundred quarts of fluid a day are sent to the baby via the umbilical cord. Fine hair begins to grow on head, eyebrows and eyelashes. Facial expressions similar to the baby's parents can be seen at this time. This month REMs (rapid eye movements) have been recorded – a sign of dreaming.

Language Experience Center

Classes for 2 year olds with communication and/ or socialization challenges will resume on January 3rd at St. Edward's Church. The classes are tentatively scheduled from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. and from 12:00 to 2:00 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The children work in groups of 6 with two teachers and "play" to improve their communication and socialization skills.

Free after-school program 2016-2017 school year for those with Autism. Participants should have 2nd grade (approximately) reading skills. They will work one-on-one with mentors in small groups on Mondays from 4:00-6:00 p.m., beginning January 9th. Children will work on non-competitive physical activities including: stations, music, dancing, yoga, crafts, games, cooking, interviewing, drama, etc. Children are asked to bring a meal to eat with the other children. This program was created to improve social and communication skills, to allow for sensory issues and a child's need for routine, to develop executive skills, and to reduce anxiety with new situations, new activities and new people.

Teachers needed. A preschool for children of 2 years of age with challenges in communication and socialization, needs teachers for the 2016-2017 school year. The classes are 2 days a week, tentatively from 9:30 a.m.-2:00 p.m. Preference will be given to applicants with an undergraduate degree in any area of child development.
