MISSION APPEAL IN THE CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF COLUMBUS 2021 for Moshi Diocese

Dear parishioners,

I am Fr Peter Asantebwana from Catholic Diocese of Moshi in Tanzania. First of all, many thanks to Bishop Robert Brennan, thanks to the Mission Office and thanks to our pastor, Fr Tony, for accepting the Diocese of Moshi to share with you her missionary experience. Thank you dear parishioners of the Blessed Sacrament Parish for your warm and generous heart to the missionaries who visit you every year to share the missionary experiences in their Mission territories. I believe the faith that is shared is the faith that is strengthened.

The Diocese of Moshi is in Tanzania, East Africa; it was evangelized by Holy Ghost missionaries who were from the United States, Ireland and France. They did not only preach the Gospel and administer sacraments, but also build churches, schools and hospitals. People educated in these schools are now priests, teachers, leaders and even myself. The missionaries are no longer in the Diocese. The indigenous bishops, priests and lay people are continuing the work started by these Missionaries.

My Diocese undertakes many spiritual and social activities for God's people; most notable are health and educational services to orphans left behind by HIV/AIDS parents, mother and father child health care in remote areas. We have 97 major seminarians who depend directly on their Bishop for their college expenses in different Major Seminaries. To accomplish some of these services, the Diocese owns and manages some schools many including two nursing colleges, five hospitals, 44 dispensaries, 35 high schools, 15 vocational training centers and more than 50 kindergartens.

Currently the Diocese of Moshi has 16 priests in a retirement center who depend totally on the Bishop for their livelihood. These priest worked hard with the missionaries in building schools, churches and hospitals. They were not paid anything and they do not have any social security or benefit. Your support is key in helping these priests who after long life time of service are no longer able to move around. They are relying on nurses/trained aides to help them. They do not have social security since all priests work as volunteers and do not have salaries like those in developed countries.

St John Paul II said "We are all called to do mission, some people do the mission by going to the mission while others do the mission by prayers and donations or material support." You can support the mission by contributing to a second collection today. Also St. Theresa of Calcutta said "If you cannot feed a 100 people now, then just feed one". Today you and I are invited to show solidarity and join the missionaries in mission land who have sacrificed their meals, time and other material things for love of God and neighbor. During my first days in US I was invited for a dinner. When at the restaurant instead of looking the food of my choice I was looking at the prices and try to recall back home. The bill for the food I took was \$26 that could be used to give one lunch for these 16 elderly priests at the retirement, but for me, I used it in a single meal.

You can sacrifice a lunch/dinner/movie or whatever you see is fitting and by that you will be touching and changing the life of these elderly priests completely. People pray for missionaries and benefactors. You are remembered in these prayers as well. That is why I said faith shared is faith strengthened.




