Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for^[a] you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' 1 Corinthians 11:24-26

Saint Paul's description of the Eucharist in his letter to the Corinthians is remarkably similar to one we could write today. The words are nearly the same as what we hear in each eucharistic prayer, including the memorial acclamation. When it comes to the celebration of the Eucharist, we have at least one thing in common with Paul: none of us were present at the Last Supper. And yet, we all can describe it so very well. This is the power of ritual. Already by when this letter was written, about twenty years or so after the death and resurrection of Jesus, the ritual of the Eucharist was well established. Two thousand years later, we still celebrate the Eucharist in a similar way and he is still present in his Body and Blood every single time.

JUBILEE PILGRIMS OF HOPE
RETREAT

Thank you to those who have signed up for the Jubilee Pilgrims of Hope Retreat on Saturday, **June 28, 2025, at our church.** The retreat begins at 9 am, and closes with Mass at 4:15 pm. The retreat focuses on hope for prisoners, rehabilitation, forgiveness, and abolition of the death penalty. This theme coincides with *Spes Non Confundit* (*Hope does not Disappoint*) paragraph 10. Bishop Steven will open the retreat by discussing hope and the sources of hope: Word of God, Holy Spirit, Paschal Mystery, and Saints of Hope. Participants will join in Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction, and engage in the Spiritual Conversation and a Mercy Hour.

Simultaneous translation into Spanish will be available, and lunch will be provided.
