

POSITIVE NEWS for our Collaborative

As we all continue to recover from the individual and collective trauma that is the Covid pandemic, and as more and more people feel comfortable going out again, we are happy and grateful to report that church attendance in our collaborative is increasing.

For example, based on a comparison of church attendance for Masses at St. Theresa's in the fall of 2021 (October, November and December) versus Masses at St. Theresa's in the fall of 2022 (October, November and December), Mass attendance is up almost 15%. This is truly good news!! (And these calculations don't even include the extraordinarily high Mass counts at both parishes at all of our six Masses during this past Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, totaling 1,356 people.)

Each week more and more people are returning, as well as many new parishioners who are coming for the first time. It is a grace that an increasing number of us are coming together for worship at the altar of Christ!
