

I have some happy, yet sad, news regarding our Fr. Brogan. Cardinal O'Malley has just appointed Fr. Brogan as the new Pastor of two beautiful parishes on the North Shore: *Saint Paul Church* in Hamilton and *Our Lady of Hope Church* in Ipswich. His new assignment will commence on June 1st.

Needless to say, this will be a major loss for all of us here in Dover/Sherborn as we have loved Fr. Brogan being here over the past year and a half. His homilies, his relatability, and yes, even his sense of humor have helped to build and re-build our faith communities at *Most Precious Blood & St. Theresa Parishes*. His presence, dedication, conscientiousness and wit – manifested in a multitude of ways – have continually blessed our parishes with the love of Christ.

As you know, Fr. Brogan came to us after serving in *St. John/St. Paul Parishes* in Wellesley. He has served in a number of parishes including *St. Catherine Parish* in Norwood, *St. Brigid/Gate of Heaven Parishes* in South Boston, and *St. Michael Parish* in North Andover.

After becoming a priest he also became a clinical psychologist after completing his Doctorate in Psychology at *William James* here in Metro West Boston. After training at such facilities as the *Veterans Affairs Hospital* in Bedford he entered into a postdoctoral fellowship at *Human Relation Services* in Wellesley where he served students at *Babson College* as well as a host of other populations throughout his training whilst residing at *St. James Parish* in Boston. Post licensure he then became Clinical Director of the Wellness Center at *St. Mary's University* in Minneapolis & Winona, Minnesota.

All of his professional, ecclesiastical and personal life experiences were brought to bear on our parishes, which have benefitted so many in such a relatively short period of time. I know he takes Dover/Sherborn with him as he embarks to serve Christ's people in Hamilton, Ipswich and Wenham on the North Shore.

Dear Friends and Fellow Parishioners –

Nearly seven years ago, Sandy and I, along with our three small children relocated from southwestern Connecticut to South Natick. In our first few weeks here, we were fortunate to stumble upon St. Theresa of Lisieux parish in Sherborn and knew immediately that it was to become our new parish. From our very first Mass, the staff and parishioners welcomed us and made all of us feel at home. Our arrival was also well-timed, as it was the previous music director's last day, and I was happy to step in as a temporary musician while the search for a permanent director was underway. One thing led to another, temporary became permanent, and I have been blessed to be a part of both the parish and the music ministry for nearly seven years.

Sandy will continue as a cantor, and I will continue to support the music ministry as a regular substitute musician across the two churches.

It has been a true pleasure being a part of the staff over the last nearly seven years. Thank you for the opportunity you've given me to make music and pray with all of you at St. Theresa of Lisieux.
