



LIVING LENT

Fr. von Arx led us in an inspiring Lenten reflection last week. His reflection centered on the book <u>The Return of the Prodigal Son</u>, by Henri Nouwen, which is a reflection on Rembrandt's painting.

Fr. von Arx had us consider whether we are most like the eldest son in the parable. His first point for meditation was: "Pray for the grace to know your sinfulness and your need for God's healing ... What is preventing you from living in God's unconditional love and becoming the person you are meant to be?"

WISH LIST

Want to help improve the lighting at St. Theresa's and help the parish save on electricity costs at the same time? The parish

recently completed an assessment through the Eversource Mass Save program to replace the lighting throughout the church with energy efficient LED lighting. 70% of the cost for the upgrades is

subsidized through the program, with the parish responsible for the remaining 30%, which is approximately \$3,500. These upgrades are estimated to save St. Theresa's \$800 every year in electricity at current rates.
