GOSPEL REFLECTION

Listen to the conviction of St. Paul and St. Peter in today's readings. In the first reading, St. Paul is ordered "to stop teaching in that name." That meant he was to stop teaching about Jesus. But St. Paul gives a clear response, "We must obey God rather than men." He was willing to face trial and suffering rather than stop speaking about Jesus.

The scene in the gospel is often referred to as "breakfast with Jesus." St. Peter, having denied Jesus three times, is given three opportunities in today's gospel to express his conviction to following Jesus. In this intimate conversation we can hear the strength of that love in each response, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." How will you express you conviction about being a follower of Jesus Christ, if asked? Take some time in quiet payer to speak from your heart with Christ.

WISH LIST

We recently completed an assessment through the Eversource Mass Save program at St. Theresa's to replace the lighting throughout the church with energy efficient LED lighting. 70% of the cost for the upgrades is subsidized through the program, with the parish responsible for the remaining 30%, which is approximately \$3,500. These upgrades are estimated to save St. Theresa's \$800 every year in electricity at current rates.
