



BOSTON HEALTHCARE FOR THE HOMELESS

Our next delivery is July 8. Some parishioners may be away yet we will continue with monthly deliveries during the summer.

Hunger or "food insecurity" knows no vacation or holiday. Food is a basic, essential need. Limitations on other sources of food due to loss of funding and other constraints has and will continue to impact the clients of BHCHP - of whom many are families with very young children.

Requested items:

- "Meals in a bag"- items to which water or milk are added and then microwaved
- Protein drinks, for any age group
- Powdered baby formula (Enfamil, Similac)
- Personal care items like toothbrushes and toothpaste
- Non-perishable foods
- Single serve, shelf stable milk and juice
- Gift cards to grocery stores
