




whose funeral Mass was held at Most Precious Blood on Saturday, July 12.

DOVER-SHERBORN CATHOLIC COMMUNITY JULY 2025 FUNDRAISER



Dear Parishioners,

First off, thank you all for your continued generosity! Your most kind giving indeed allows our Community to do all the good that we do.

We are having a major Increased Offertory Campaign in Autumn to increase our regular income rate (which is the most important metric of the financial health of parishes). In the meantime however, both Parishes have had some very much needed expenses that we would like to defray. Below is an outline of such expenses, why they were needed, and their costs.

We are happy to explain further, and, we'll soon publish the usual annual financials.

Most Precious Blood Parish

\$46,000 for New Boiler and Water Coil

The boiler one unexpectedly "melted down"

\$25,000 for New Paint for Lower Hall and Rel Ed Classrooms

Peeling and flaking, holes in the wall, rust stains from leakages

\$14,000 for Drain and Plumbing Repair to Ladies Restroom

The toilets and drainage system failed causing sewage flooding

\$11,000 for Elevator Fix

Elevator broke down and needed three separate repairs

\$5,000 for New Lighting for Rel Ed Classroom:

Old Lighting is insufficient and harsh, teachers/students have hard time seeing

\$4,000 for New Bulletin/White Boards, and Ed TVs for Rel Ed Classrooms

Old Chalkboards and Bulletin Boards were crumbling and unusable, no Ed TVs

\$2,000 for Floor Cleaning

Lower Hall and Rel Ed Classroom tile floor badly needs a cleaning and polishing

St. Theresa Parish

\$220,000 for the 2022 Exterior Church Repairs

Back in 2022 the exterior of the church needed major repairs, such repairs came out very well, however it depleted the Savings Account

A good rule is to have a 250K in savings (in addition to the Endowment)

\$50,000 for the Loss of the Cell Phone Tower Income

In March of 2024, the Cellular Company that was giving an annual rental income of \$50,000, determined they no longer needed the transmitter and they cancelled it

\$22,000 for the Water Well Fix

The water well failed and the parish was without water

\$4,000 for Electric Stoves

There was a gas leak with the old gas stove, the stove was also obsolete

\$3,000 for Floor and Carpet Cleaning

The carpets had some mold, and the tile floor was grimy

Any amount given is tremendously helpful. Thank you so much for prayerfully considering!

He Came To Natick in 1854 And A Tradition Was Born



Founder. John Everett

Coming from Kilmacow, County Kilkenny, John Everett was the type of strong character that Ireland sent to this country in the 1840's. After humble beginnings as a shoemaker in Cambridge, Medway and Millis, he finally settled in Natick in 1854. Here,

with a small band of Catholics, under the direction of Fr. John Walsh, he helped found St. Patrick's Parish in 1856. John Everett became sexton of the church and superintendent of the cemetery. In 1861, a growing need in the Natick Community prompted Fr. Walsh to ask John to establish a funeral undertaking business, and so a tradition of quiet, dignified and sympathetic understanding was born. Now, after four generations, that tradition is still an integral part of our service.
