

EVANGELIZATION

August 24 ~ Twenty-first Sunday of Ordinary Time

Isaiah is speaking on behalf of the Lord, directly to us: "...proclaim my glory among the nations." This might seem like too much of a challenge. Take a few minutes to ask God to whom should you be proclaiming God's glory. Is it a family member, a co-worker or a friend? Tell YOUR story of the importance of Jesus in your life. And, in case you think that task is for someone else, the Church in her wisdom reminds each one of us in today's psalm refrain: "Go out to all the world and tell the good news!"

August 31 ~ Twenty-second Sunday of Ordinary Time

Today's readings highlight the importance of the virtue of humility. In the first reading we hear, "conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts." In the Gospel parable, we hear Jesus say, "everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Humility is not about weakness. Rather humility is freedom from pride and arrogance, a quality which is rare in our world. A humble person recognizes that all of life and all that we possess is a gift from God. This week, pray for the grace to eliminate any conceit or feelings of self-importance so as to grow in humility and truth.



He Came To Natick in 1854 And A Tradition Was Born



Founder. John Everett

Coming from Kilmacow, County Kilkenny, John Everett was the type of strong character that Ireland sent to this country in the 1840's. After humble beginnings as a shoemaker in Cambridge, Medway and Millis, he finally settled in Natick in 1854. Here,

with a small band of Catholics, under the direction of Fr. John Walsh, he helped found St. Patrick's Parish in 1856. John Everett became sexton of the church and superintendent of the cemetery. In 1861, a growing need in the Natick Community prompted Fr. Walsh to ask John to establish a funeral undertaking business, and so a tradition of quiet, dignified and sympathetic understanding was born. Now, after four generations, that tradition is still an integral part of our service.
