Deliberate Gratitude

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

I'm not sure about you, but when I was kid, after my birthday party, or Christmas, or whenever I received a gift from anybody, my mother would sit me down with a stack of little cards and have me write

thank you notes to all the friends and relatives from whom I had received a gift. It's something I still do today.

Her message was always very clear. One may be grateful, but unexpressed gratitude is no gratitude at all. To be real, your gratitude has to have a concrete expression. For young Leo, that meant writing thank you cards. I've found it works pretty well for Fr. Leo in the present day as well. People like to know that you received their gift

What if we were to apply that same principle to the gifts we have received from God? The gift of his Son? The gift of his ministry, his passion, death and resurrection? The forgiveness of our sins? The sacraments of the Church? The fellowship of our parish family? Indeed, if you think about it, all that we are and have is gift from God.

What concrete expression will our gratitude to God take? How do we make it real?

The language of Christian Stewardship gives us a vocabulary and a way to do so. Briefly stated, in gratitude to almighty God for all the blessings we have received, the Christian steward makes a planned, proportionate response of time, talent and treasure to the parish and to the local community. The key words here are "planned and proportionate."

It's deliberate gratitude.

This week, all registered families received a copy of the Parish Handbook to help you discern where your gifts might best be offered, along with some commitment forms and other helpful information. The fabulous Ministry Faire, is also this weekend in the Deacons Hall so that you can get first-hand information from those involved in the various ministries in the parish.

Like the Psalmist, ask yourself, "How shall I make a return to the Lord, for all the good he has done for me?" (Psalm 116). Then next week, make that gratitude real in a way that is pleasing to the giver.






C.H.A.O.S. Oktoberfest Show


