To God What is God's

Of all the Founding Fathers, Ben Franklin is one of my favorites and certainly one of the most quotable. In a letter to a friend in 1789, he wrote concerning the latest develop-

ments of the nascent American republic, "Our new Constitution is now established, everything seems to promise it will be durable; but, *in this world, nothing is certain except death and taxes,*" That last phrase about death and taxes has become part of the American lexicon.

Taxes, it seems, have always been part of society, even in the time of Jesus. So what's the story with the question from the Pharisees to Jesus about the census tax to Caesar?

Quite simply, the popularity of Jesus, and the nature of his message was a threat to their religious authority. He was not the messiah they were expecting, so they were looking for ways to discredit him. Some background helps. By this time, Caesar had declared himself divine. Thus he could be considered a false god according to the law. However, as emperor, he was also head of state. Their scheme with the census tax was to try to put Jesus in a situation where no matter what answer he gave, they could denounce in him. If he said it was lawful to pay the tax, then they could say he did not follow the Law of Moses. If he said it was unlawful, then they could denounce him to the local authorities as a rebel.

Jesus is smarter than that, of course. His response is ingenious. First he exposes their duplicity. The coin that he asks them to present had Caesar's image on it. The irony here is that the Pharisees themselves are carrying around the image of a false god. But it is the second part of his response that takes us beyond useless banter about local and national politics and into the contemplation of the Kingdom. As good Christians, how are we to *repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God*?

One way is to ask what belongs to Caesar. That is, what does the Christian owe to civil society? Christians should be good citizens, helping to build up a more just society.

Second, we can ask, "What belongs to God?" Think about that one for a minute. Think of all the physical stuff that belongs to you. Will you take any of it with you at the end of this life when you go to stand before the Father? No, you will not. The only thing we take with us is the relationships that we build in this life, especially our communion with Christ and with others. Even those are a gift from God. In the end, everything belongs to God.

There is marvelous freedom in this. We are stewards, not owners. Our only task, and our eternal vocation, is to return all that we have received back to God with increase. - Fr. Leo


