

Waiting on God

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

We are seeing a lot more people preparing for marriage in the parish these days. How appropriate that we have the parable of the wise and foolish vir-

gins waiting for the bridegroom for the gospel this week. What's going on in the parable anyway?

Marriage customs in the days of Jesus in Judah were a bit different than in Alaska these days. There were four stages to a marriage: the pounding out of the marriage contract between the two heads of the families, the betrothal, the transfer of the bride to the bridegroom's house, and the wedding feast.

The parable illustrates the third stage. Folks learned early on that if you kept marrying women from your own village, eventually the kids would not turn out quite right. Thus, your wife usually came from a village or town some distance away. The groom would leave with his attendants to get his bride and then bring her back to his village. At the gates of the village, they were met with great fanfare. The ten virgins in the parable are likely part of the welcoming committee in the bride's village.

The only problem is that travel being what it was in those days, you never really knew just when the bridegroom would show up. It could be in the middle of the day or the middle of the night. You might be waiting for awhile. Jesus uses this very common image to make a point that in the same way, we need to be waiting and watchful for when the Lord comes.

Years back, a wise monk named Aidan Shay told me, "In my experience, so much of prayer is simply waiting on God. And I have found that if I am willing to wait long enough, insight always comes."

Abbot Aidan got it right. Our Lord comes into our lives in so many different ways. We need to be watchful, and we need to be patient, for we do not really know when and where that encounter will take place.




Volunteer Cooks Needed!

Amen.


ADVENT CANDLES AND WREATHS SALES

<u>Weekly Reflection</u> from John Spears, St. Joseph Catholic Church, Richardson, TX

Our readings this week speak of waiting. What makes waiting so hard at times Perhaps it's that, while waiting, we feel incomplete. "If I could just get success, love, achievement, etc., then all would be well!" n the epistle, the Thessalonians are waiting for the Second Coming of Christ. We hear in St. Paul's words that he and they expect that this will happen in their lifetimes. But it's been about 20 years now since Christ ascended. People are dying. Will they be left out? Paul assures them to keep the hope of the promise of Christ that all will be joined together when he returns. In the meantime, we wait, we hope, we accept our incompleteness, and, as the Gospel exhorts us, we stay vigilant, for we know neither the day nor the hour.

Prayer - In prayer for our waiting and restlessness, let us recall the simple words of St. Augustine: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."







This effort will form a network of response centers ready to serve

communities in a hurricane or other natural disaster once the solar power equipment is completely installed. By using solar power and backup batteries, the response centers can continue operating in the event of power loss—but they will also be using clean, renewable energy rather than fossil fuels that contribute to climate change and pollution.
