

Talents

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's amazing what one can learn on the Internet. I've heard the parable of the talents hundreds if not thousands of times, but I never bothered to find

out how much a talent was actually worth. Turns out it is quite a bit. A talent was worth about 6000 denarii. You will recall from the parable of the generous landowner that a denarius was a typical day's wage. So assuming a six day work week, a talent was worth about 20 years of wages! Given that most people didn't live to be 50 in those days, a talent represented an entire lifetime of work. IT was worth a whole career. For me, that gives the parable of the talents a whole new dimension.

The first point of the story is that we are not owner's we are stewards. All that we have and are has been given to us by God. Like the various servants in the story, our task is to take those gifts and to use them in a way that is pleasing to the giver, and to return it all to him with increase.

The talents can represent many things. They can represent the gift of faith. As Deacon Mick pointed out so well last week, you can only be responsible for your own faith. Just as you cannot go jogging for someone else, we are each responsible for the gift of faith and spiritual life. No one can do that for us.

Second, they can represent the seemingly mundane gifts of time, talent and treasure that we have received. Like the psalmist we should pray, "How shall I make a return to the Lord for all the good he has done for me?" (Ps. 116)

Finally, given the magnitude of what a talent is worth, they can represent one's entire life. Make no mistake, at the end of this life each of us will be called to account for what we have done with this life that we have been given. When that time comes, what a blessing it will be when we hear Our Lord say, "Well done, good and faithful servant! Come, share your master's joy!" - Fr. Leo

CONGRATULATIONS TO LISA NASH!



Your generous support of our Operating Fund in Fiscal Year 23 resulted in another positive Operating margin totaling \$24,794, this despite a small decline in total Operating revenue (-2.8%, net unrealized investment gain/loss), and a modest increase in Operating expenses (+2.9%). Three main factors influenced the increase in our Operating expenses: 1) increased parish activities post-pandemic; 2) Inflation; 3) our aging facilities — Facilities being the largest category to exceed our budget projection.


Feast of St. Cecelia

Volunteering for Advent / Christmas


