# New to the Parish?





I worked a lot of construction in my day as a laborer. For those of you who don't know what laborers do, it involves the busi-

ness end of a shovel or rake or some other piece of equipment that will move earth, concrete, or just about anything else. It's hard work, but good work. When you show up, there is an empty piece of ground. When you leave, there's proof you've been there.

Anybody who has ever worked a building project, or a road project, or any project knows that the most important part of the job is the dirt work and the foundation. As we learned with the old rectory/JPII Center, you can build a beautiful and functional structure, but if you do not have good ground and a good foundation under it, when it gets stressed it will collapse in a heap of rubble.

The Romans were great builders. One of the ways they solidified their empire was to build a system of imperial roads to every corner of the empire. These were massive projects even by today's standards. They moved millions of cubic yards of earth. They literally leveled mountains and filled valleys so that commerce and the Roman Legions could travel quickly and efficiently. They were so well built that some imperial road beds are still in use today.

This is the kind of image that Isaiah had in mind when he talked about making straight the way of the Lord. So too, John the Baptist invokes the image of making straight a highway for God. In this case, they are talking about making straight the way of the Lord into one's heart.

It's a good meditation for each of us on this Second Sunday of Advent. How easy do we make it for Jesus to come into our lives? Have we cleared the brush of bad habits and bad attitudes? Have we filled in the potholes of sin? How about the scraping off the snow and ice of the near occasions of sin? Have we been removing the "falling rocks" of grudges, resentments, and jealousy?

Last week I encouraged you to spend 20 minutes a day clearing out the physical clutter in your home. Those who have done so, have already spend 2 hours and 20 minutes getting their physical house in order. Let's take that same energy and apply it to our spiritual life as well.






