Building for Jesus

It's funny how certain verses in scripture will stand out depending on what is going on in your life at the time. I have read this passage from the Gospel of John about Jesus cleansing the temple

dozens if not hundreds of times. What leaped out at me this week?

"This temple has been under construction for 46 years..."

For over five years we have been working with FE-MA, the State, and then the Archdiocese on the demolition, design, and replacement of the old St. John Paul II Center that was destroyed in the earthquake of December 2018. It has been a long and arduous journey. There are still some hoops to jump through, but it looks like we are nearing the end. The contract for the demolition of the old building has been signed and it should be coming down within the month. The design is at 100% and the project has gone out to bid, with the bids closing on March 6th. If all goes well, construction will begin as soon as the ground thaws. As soon as the last piece of paper is signed, then we will roll out the drawings, etc. With a reception room, that can hold 75 people, with a warming kitchen and five large meeting rooms, it is quite lovely and should serve us well for many generations. Once it is completed, we can begin work on all the other projects that are in the wings like the baptismal font, the sacristy, the stained glass windows, and the completion of The Cloister.

However, we should take a lesson from the story about the Temple. It is all too easy to forget that this is first and foremost a place of worship, then of formation, then of evangelization. If the life of our parish family is not centered around Christ in the Eucharist, then nothing we build, no program that we organize, no initiative that we promote will have any lasting effect. As our parish prayer says,

May Christ be with us!

May Christ be before us!

May Christ be in us, Christ be over all!

I'll keep you posted as things progress. In the meantime, let us keep one another in prayer. - Fr. Leo



Raising Chickens to Support Her Family



First Half Summary

Despite our fairly flat Alaskan economy, our Operating Revenue for the first half of Fiscal Year 2024 is up slightly over the same period last year, and almost \$14,000 above expectations. Due to increased attendance in our faith formation programs (great news!), and inflation, expenses were unfavorable related to budget by almost \$25,000.

Nonetheless, we managed a positive Operating margin of \$11,850!
