

○ A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS ∞

Dear sisters and brothers,

As our Lenten journey inches closer to the events of Palm Sunday and Holy Week, we turn our focus to Jesus as he approaches "his hour" on the lonesome road to Calvary. In today's Gospel we encounter Jesus in Jerusalem. He knows that the hour is at hand, when he will drive out the ruler of this world, the devil. Jesus knows he is about to die, and he knows how it is going to happen, as he refers to being lifted up. I will draw everyone to myself, he says, a fitting reminder to us that he does not give his life only for the sins of a few, but so that all may be forgiven and redeemed. Jesus chooses to become that grain of wheat that falls to the ground and dies that it may produce the fruit of salvation for all who believe. He tells us that if we are to serve him, then we must follow him, taking up our crosses and joining him at Calvary, that one day, we all may share in his victory.

In our baptism, we, too, are like a grain of wheat: dying to sin, that we may come alive in Christ Jesus. As the Letter to the Hebrews tells us, on the cross Jesus became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him. The Lord teaches us about the cost of discipleship. Jesus held nothing back in obtaining salvation for us by defeating our greatest enemies of sin, Satan, and death. We are called, likewise, to make an investment in our salvation, to be willing to work for it and suffer for it just as he did.

As Jesus offered prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears for us and for our salvation, so, too, we join our pains and sufferings with his. We bring him our fears, faults, and failings, even our lack of forgiveness, that all might be washed away by the holy water and blood that flows from his side on the cross. In Christ, God's law is written on the human heart with the blood of Jesus.

Let us come and stand at the beginning of Holy Week next Sunday. We will solemnly walk with Jesus through his passion and death and at the end of which we will celebrate his Resurrection and our own initiation into these mysteries. Let us be attentive in these final days of our preparation.

Days of Fast & Abstinence

The current regulations concerning Lenten fasting and abstinence for Roman Catholics in the United States generally are as follows:

<u>Abstinence from all meat</u> is to be observed by all Roman Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.

<u>Fasting</u> is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Roman Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 60. Catholics may eat only one full meal during the day. Additionally, they may eat up to two small meals or snacks. Any amount of water or other beverages may be consumed.

For Roman Catholics whose health or ability to work would be negatively affected by fasting and/or abstinence, the regulations above do not apply.


