

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Good Shepherd Sunday and Mother's Day.

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is celebrated as Good Shepherd Sunday. This particular Sunday has always coincided with the following passage from the Gospel according to St. John: "I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." The exact verses change each year, but they all revolve around Jesus calling himself the "Good Shepherd." It is a day to focus on Jesus' role as shepherd of souls and our role of following his voice wherever he goes.

By virtue of our baptism, we are all shepherds for one another, with Jesus Christ as our Good Shepherd.
