PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

™ FROM THE DESK OF DEACON STEVE

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany in which the Evangelist, Matthew, tells us of the visit of the Magi to the newborn Jesus. We are blessed here at St. Charles Borromeo parish to have a pastor who each month orders a number of copies of "The Word Among Us." This great publication not only provides us with the Mass readings and prayers for every day during the month, but also contains written articles that share wisdom to help guide us on our faith journey. Perhaps the most important contributions that are contained in this prayer aid are the daily reflections provided for the scripture readings of the Mass of the day.

The reflection for January 8 gives us a different look at the Magi's visit and serves to remind us how their journey to greet the newborn King, Jesus, should inspire us today, two millennia later. These wise men likely made a thousand-mile journey lasting four months while protecting valuable gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. There was the danger of robbery, accident, bad weather and rough terrain, yet they were not deterred from reaching their goal. I hope that those of you who picked up your free copy of "The Word Among Us" will take the opportunity to read that reflection today. For those of you who have neglected to grab a copy of this gem of a publication, please get yours before they are all taken and then use it each day during the month as fuel for your journey of faith.

The story of the Magi is one that is familiar to us since our childhood. We all know the Christmas carol, "We Three Kings." But I wonder how many of us, including myself, truly try to put ourselves in the shoes of those three courageous men in a spiritual sense. We need to ask ourselves some questions. How determined am I in my efforts to meet Jesus? What gifts do I offer Him? When things in life do not go my way, do I give up in frustration and lose faith in God, or do I exhibit the persistence of the Magi?

The Magi traveled hundreds of miles to see Jesus. At first they went to Jerusalem, only to find he was not there. They did not get frustrated and quit. When Satan tried to fool them through the lies of evil King Herod, they did not fall victim to the selfishness of the world. Instead, they took faith in God's message received in a dream and complied with God's will. Matthew tells us that the Magi were "overjoyed" when they found the Lord. Have we experienced that "joy" in finding the

Lord? Until we experience Jesus Christ in a personal way, realizing that he became man and died for us as if we were the only person in world, then we miss out on the joy that can come in that type of intimate relationship with our Savior.

This new year, 2023, make a resolution to develop a "Magi relationship" with Jesus.
