#### **○ A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS** ∞

Dear Parishioners,

I wish you a blessed Mother's Day! I am praying that all will continue to rejoice in the blessings of God.

As we continue in this Easter season, our readings make it clear that while Jesus calls us to a very real, deeply intimate, and personal relationship, his call does not end there. We are not merely to be disciples, but to be missionary disciples.

Philip and the other Apostles recognized that they had been sent, that the Church of Christ was not something to be maintained, but something to be built. They were not content to think and pray about their personal relationship with the Lord, but instead they felt compelled by the same Lord to constantly add to the body of Christ. Thus, they never miss an opportunity to speak to those they encounter.

In the first reading, the Apostle Philip has come to Samaria to preach the Gospel among the Gentiles, who are amazingly receptive to what he tells them. The word is powerful there as demons are cast out, many of the sick are healed, and great joy fills the city. In Jesus' name by the power of the Holy Spirit, the Apostles enjoy great success on this first missionary journey beyond the borders of Judah.

Every Christian is compelled to this same mission by the same Lord. Our mission is simple: Testify to him. To testify means "to witness to." We are not all called to offer this witness in the same way; to evangelize we do not have to be pastors, teachers, or professional ministers. We do, though, have to be willing to be attentive to someone besides our own selves. We must think, for example, of what Christ may want to say to our neighbor who is hurting, or to walk gently and patiently with family members fallen away from Christ for a time.

Pope Paul VI clearly reminded us that the Church "exists in order to evangelize." This mission to bring Christ into our world will not be easy; it will mean some experience of the same rejection and suffering that was met by our Lord. Yet, this mission is deeply life-giving, and we are not in it alone. Rather, the Spirit of truth, sent from the Father by the Son, testifies with us.

Let us pray, then, that we each can be a witness an example of the joy and beauty of this life lived with Christ, and testify to him. In the second reading, Saint Peter tells us to always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope. All Christians are called to testify to the hope we have received in Christ.

# The Importance of Pre-Planning for When Death Comes

"Tempus fugit, memento mori." Time flies, remember death. All of us will one day have to meet our maker. The Church does its best to help each one of us prepare spiritually for that day. However, it is also important to practically prepare for that day. By preplanning we relieve our loved ones to have to make rushed decisions at the time we pass away.

Veteran funeral directors, Mike and Tracey Carpenter, will be at St. Charles on **Monday** evening, **May 22**, at **7:00pm**, to discuss the importance and practicality of pre-planning the details of one's eventual funeral. Funeral pre-planning consists of two parts:

- 1) a discussion of all of the family's choices regarding visitation and services with a casket selection, a burial vault selection, a Church service vs. a service at the funeral home and finally a choice of cemetery. There are many options that can be discussed if a family chooses cremation.
- 2) A plan for the payment of the arrangements which can help freeze the costs and take that financial burden off of your family.

The Carpenters will do an overview of the above information and then open the floor to any questions

regarding funeral service itself and the thoughts about pre-planning funeral services. Other topics included:

- Veteran benefits
- Medicaid and Social Security
- · Who will need death certificates
- Cremation requirements- there are 3
- Flower selections
- · Catering & food in the funeral home

We hope you will find this presentation to be worthwhile. It is FREE and open to the public.
