

#### PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

#### **○ A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS** ∞

Dear Parish Family,

As we gather today, some of us may feel troubled or abandoned in some way. We may be, in any number of senses, like sheep without a shepherd. God sees us in our struggles, in our wanderings, in our suffering, and in our pain. Our readings today show us that God never abandons us but works to gather us back to himself.

In the first reading the Lord said, *I bore you up on eagle wings and brought you here to myself.* Preparing all things for the coming of the Messiah, God tells his people, *You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation.* 

In the Gospel, Jesus responds to his *troubled* and abandoned people, empowering his disciples to cure the sick and cleanse lepers.

Finally, Saint Paul reminds us that Jesus died for us while we were still helpless, offering us reconciliation through his life and death.

God continues that work today. He is reaching out to us, here in this Mass. He is empowering his followers to go out to those who need to hear his word and draw all into God's love. We should never forget that, in the sacrament of baptism, we are each anointed as priests, prophets, and kings. God called each of us by name; a truth represented by the calling by name that happens at the beginning of the rite of baptism. We are anointed with the oil of catechumens and then the sacred chrism. We are given this sacramental gift of Christ's very self so that we can, like those first disciples, go out to bring God's healing and love to all the world. Through the power of the sacrament of baptism, the Church is a kingdom of priests, a holy nation.

If we still feel hesitant to follow in the footsteps of the first disciples, let us turn our eyes toward Jesus, who gives himself to us, with all his power. We are fueled in this work by the Eucharist. If Christ is with me, whom should I fear? The Lord, our strong and gentle shepherd, is calling. He sends us out, for the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few. May we recognize all that we are given in this Blessed Sacrament and pour out its blessings on the world as we go forth!

# BE A PART OF THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL!



We officially kicked off the National Eucharistic Revival's Year Two on Corpus Christi Sunday. For the next twelve months we will be promoting growth in belief in the Real Presence of Jesus, body and blood, soul and divinity, in the Holy Eucharist here at

St. Charles Borromeo parish. This belief is one that is impossible to grasp solely with our intellect. We must come to the belief in our hearts to truly appreciate this gift from our Lord. You may say, "Where do I begin?" Begin by reading the 6th chapter of John's gospel. When the followers of Jesus heard him say that they must eat his body and drink his blood, many of them abandoned him in disgust. However, his Apostles did not abandon him even though they at that time could not understand what he meant by what seemed like cannibalism. It was at the Last Supper that they began to finally comprehend what Jesus meant. He told them the bread was his body and the wine was his blood. This was not simply symbolic. Through the actions of the priest at Mass *Transubstantiation* takes place. What that means is while the bread and wine maintain their visual appearance, in substance they become the body and blood of Jesus. He becomes physically present to us and when we consume that real food, Jesus physically becomes a part of us. If we take that seriously, then we leave the Mass and go into our divided world unified in Communion with Jesus Christ. This great mystery and miracle should encourage us to bring his message into our families, our workplaces and our communities. #### CHURCH RENOVATIONS . . .

Dear Parishioners,

The long-anticipated repairs and restoration of our Historic Church are commencing just in time for the beginning of the yearlong celebration of the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary of St. Charles Borromeo Parish. Our contractor



began the earliest phases of the work last Monday, June 12<sup>th</sup>. Our budget will enable us to achieve the following major work elements that have been part of a vision going back to 2012 and earlier:

- Repair the damaged plasterwork and repaint the church.
- Replace the deteriorated carpeting with low-maintenance, long-life floor finishes using a combination of LVP and Porcelain Tile
- Bring the Sanctuary into compliance with the National Council of Catholic Bishops design criteria by providing a safer and properly sized Sanctuary Platform and centrally located Tabernacle location.
- Provide modern energy-conserving LED lighting systems with proper lighting levels.

The work is anticipated to continue until the end of August. It will involve overhead scaffolding for about 60 days to allow cost-effective repairs, refinishing the ceiling, and the new lighting system. The scaffolding will not go up for a few weeks because we await delivery of the lighting fixtures. The Church will continue to be used for Saturday evening and Sunday morning Mass but will be closed Monday through Friday, except for Holy Days.

We have presented our plans to Archbishop Lori, who supports this work. He did make a few suggestions, which we have incorporated. Repairs to the church began around 2012 with the roof leaks and the exterior walls. We will update the Parishioners weekly through our website and weekly bulletin as the work progresses.

We have other side projects that are not included in these major renovations. I will ask you to prayerfully consider sponsoring these for our 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration. These projects were chosen to complement the ongoing renovations. Some parishioners have already indicated that they would like to give an anniversary gift to St. Charles, and these additional projects would benefit from such generosity.

Thank you for your patience and understanding throughout this period.
