PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

○ A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS ∞

Dear Parishioners,

In writing to the Romans, Paul says that the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. He is reiterating the teaching of Christ, indeed, his greatest commandment. The commandment to love, inclusive of one another, oneself, and God, is found in all four of the Gospels.

Jesus is the love of God made flesh. He came *out* of love *for* love. He came to save us, to make us whole again, to make us holy. The love that Jesus commands, and that Jesus lives, is not a set of warm or fuzzy feelings. It is a profound willing of our good, and a selfless desire that we be who we are made to be.

This is the love we also are commanded to live. We are asked to will: to want, to seek, to make happen, the good of those God puts around us. This is not always easy, and it is not always pleasant. We see examples of this in both the reading from Ezekiel and in our Gospel.

The Lord tells the prophet Ezekiel that he will be held responsible for the death of the wicked if he does not *speak out to dissuade* him. In the Gospel, then, Jesus gives instructions on how we should correct those who sin against us; how to raise our voices against wickedness, speaking out and speaking up when we see others living apart from God. To do so is to love, and it is a commandment. In following the command to love one another in the ways just described, we can help others find the path toward life. And Christ, who is present here in this sacrament, gives us the grace to do just that.

Christ in the Eucharist is the ultimate example of radical love. After all, he gives himself to each one of us without exception, sinners though we are. Love builds up. And so, as we leave here with him physically present within us, with a grace that transforms us, the question is not "How can we do the same for others?" but "How can we not?"

Our Parish Religious Education program is ready to welcome the children once again. As I have said over and over, I kindly ask parents to register the children now. This will help us plan appropriately in terms of the number of materials to order.

God be with you this week! *Fr. Canisius*

AN INVITATION FROM DEACON STEVE: BE A PART OF THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL!



I recently purchased a great little book from Marian Press in Massachusetts edited by Father Donald Calloway, M.I.C.. It is entitled <u>Eucharistic Gems</u>, <u>Daily Wisdom on the Blessed</u> <u>Sacrament</u>. For each day of the year

there is a brief quote from saints and other holy people who possessed a great devotion to the Eucharist. Two recent entries really hit me as profound. The first comes from St. Peter Julian Eymard, a French priest who lived from 1811-1868. Although he lived two centuries ago, the concerns of his time were similar to our own in 2023. Reflect on what he wrote a long time ago: "Exposition (of the Blessed Sacrament) is the form of worship our time needs. It is necessary in order to save society. Society is killing itself, because it no longer has a center of gravity and charity. There is no more family life: everyone isolates himself, concentrates on himself, wants to suffice unto himself. Disintegration is imminent. But society will be born again, full of vigor, when all its members come and join together around our Emmanuel." A more modern saint, one known well by us, Mother Teresa of Calcutta, reminds us simply and profoundly, "When we look at the cross, we know how much Jesus loved us. When we look at the tabernacle, we know how much Jesus loves us now." As the initial phase of the St. Charles Borromeo parish church restoration comes to its completion, we will have the opportunity to gaze on our beautiful crucifix above the altar while simultaneously fixing our eyes on the tabernacle that will sit just below, reminding us of how Jesus loved us both then and now. "Sacred Host, greatest aid to holiness, have mercy on us!"


