

### PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

### ○ A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS ∞

Dear Parishioners,

The Christian life is a communal life, not a solitary one. Thus, it entails times of being reconciled to God and with one another.

Saint Paul explains why it is necessary for us to be reconciled with each other if we ever have hope of being reconciled with God. We are the Lord's, we belong to Christ, and we are to conform ourselves to him: None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself. We are a community of believers. We are all sinners, and need to give and receive from each other what we need from the Lord – mercy. We are meant to treat others the way God has treated us in Christ, sharing with them the life-giving and forgiving love of Jesus.

"What does that look like, exactly?" we might ask. This is at the heart of Peter's question in today's Gospel. "What does forgiveness look like, Lord, forgiving my brother seven times?" That seems like a reasonable number, does it not? Especially if it is for the same thing? Except Jesus said *seventy-seven times* was the answer. And lest we get stuck on the exact numbers rather than the larger point, Jesus tells the parable of the unforgiving servant. Completely upside down in his debt, with no hope to repay it, and he must throw himself completely on his master's mercy.

His debt is miraculously forgiven! Yet, rather than reforming his life, changing his heart, and sharing with others the mercy just shown him, the servant imprisons someone who owes him a much smaller amount. In response, the master hands him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt.

We can forgive, and we can seek forgiveness. And as "seventy-seven" represents the limitless nature of God's mercy toward us, so we can make it represent ours to one another. As we receive the Lord in the Eucharist, may it nourish the soil of our hearts, conforming us ever more to the image of Christ and making us more like our good and generous God.

# AN INVITATION FROM DEACON STEVE: BE A PART OF THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL!



You may have heard the saying that when someone faces a life-threatening situation their "life flashes before their eyes." When I was 20 years old my grandmother and her gentleman friend, Robert, wanted to drive to Florida to visit

with some relatives. As much as I was fond of Robert, he was the world's worst driver and my grandmother did not have a driver's license. So, I took off a week from my summer job so that I could do the driving. Surely, I thought, if I let Robert drive they would get killed in an accident and I would never see them again. I drove all the way to Florida with Robert simply riding shotgun. Every 50 miles or so he would ask, "Steve, would you like me to drive for a while?" Even if I had felt sleepy there was no way I was giving him the wheel. Also, every time he would ask about driving, my grandmother sitting in the back seat sounding like a parrot would say, "Let Robert drive. Let Robert drive." I finally could not take it any longer. On the way back while in Georgia, I finally gave Robert the wheel. Five minutes later we were on a twolane highway with a speed limit of 70. That wasn't good enough for Robert. Doing 85 he was right on the bumper of the car in front of us. He decided to pass on a double yellow line and gassed up that Chevy as fast as it would go. Headed right toward us at an equally high speed was a silver Corvette. I still remember the fearful face of the driver as we headed toward a deadly collision. I yelled, "Robert, the car!" He responded, "I see it," and proceeded to cut in front of the vehicle we were passing missing the Corvette by only a couple of feet. In that instant of an actual near-death experience, every important person and event of my life flashed in front of me like it was on a big movie screen. My parents, siblings, grandparents and closest friends suddenly were all in view. Also in view was my First Holy Communion at St. James Church. I guess that was an indication of how important the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holv Eucharist was for me. If faced with a similar frightening experience, how likely would that Eucharistic scene flash before your eyes? "Oh Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like thine."
