

○ A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS %

Dear friends in Christ,

Isaiah tells us that God's ways are above our ways and his thoughts are above our thoughts. As an example, the parable about the landowner's decision to pay all of the workers the same wage no matter how long they worked in his vineyard can be confusing. It seems to offend our sense of fairness.

But Jesus turns our perspective upside down when the landowner asks, Am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous? Jesus' focus on the landowner, his generosity in paying the workers who only found the job at his vineyard at the last minute, draws our focus to God.

God is that generous landowner, who welcomes people to his vineyard until the very last moment. For God, it is never too late for people to come to him and seek to serve him and do his will. God loves all of us as his children, and his mercy extends beyond our own conceptions of place and time.

As we go about our day, let us seek God and remember his generosity to us, his love and mercy that are so high above us that we cannot even fathom them. And no matter when we entered his vineyard, let us thank God for the opportunity to work for him.

AN INVITATION FROM DEACON STEVE: BE A PART OF THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL!



There is a word that is unique to the Catholic faith – *Transubstantiation*. It is the word used to describe when the bread and wine is changed into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ during the Consecration at Holy Mass. While

the bread and wine remain visible as bread and wine, in substance they become the Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ (see Mark 14: 22-24; Luke 22: 19-20; Matt. 26: 26-28: 1 Corinthians 11: 23-28: John 6: 48-71). Our human intellect finds it impossible to fully grasp this concept. It leaves us with a choice: Believe what Jesus tells us about the Eucharist, or discard the literal meaning of his words as merely symbolism. St. John Chrysostom (A.D. 347-407) was the archbishop of Constantinople, a Doctor of the Church, and the greatest preacher of his time. He offered timeless wisdom on the importance of having faith in the sanctity of the Blessed Sacrament even when our minds found it impossible to grasp the concept of transubstantiation. "Let me submit to God in all things and not contradict him, even if what he savs seems to contradict our reason and intellect: let his word prevail over our reason and intellect. Let us act in this way with regard to the Eucharistic mysteries, and not limit our attention just to what can be perceived by the senses, but instead hold fast to his words. For his word cannot deceive." It is important that when it comes to the Eucharist we should be willing to let faith take over when reason reaches its limit as we grapple to understand the Real Presence.

The position of the new tabernacle has been outlined and a tentative design for the new Sacred Heart shrine has been created. Off-site, the Stations are being repainted and Mary is getting some new color. We are really beginning to see progress now! 
