

PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

○ A REFLECTION FROM BIENVENU ∞

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In today's readings, the prophet Isaiah announces the destruction of his people by comparing them to a vine where only thorns and brambles will grow in the greatest drought. God, who expects from His vineyard (the people of Israel) repentance, lawfulness, and justice, reaps only iniquity and distress. In Psalm 79, a psalm of trust in times of distress, the people implore God to come and visit His vine in order to revive it. In his letter to the Philippians, Paul describes how the Christian community should seek this revival and respond to God's call for repentance. The Christian community will bear the fruit that God desires of it, only if it seeks what is just and returns to God with a sincere heart.

In today's Gospel, Jesus illustrates the history of the people of Israel, the people chosen by God. Those to whom God has leased His vineyard are the priests and elders of the people as well as the Scribes. In other words, God has leased His vineyard to all those who interpreted His Commandments. The servants represent the many prophets who were sent by God to call Israel to conversion but were persecuted and killed.

God, the landowner, is a loving and merciful God who gives the wicked tenants several chances to repent, sending more and more servants. Yet they are all treated poorly. God repeatedly invites us to repentance too. For God, it is never too late for us to come to Him for forgiveness. As our loving Father, God calls us to change our wrongdoings and come back to Him, He who is the source of mercy. He loves each of us as His children, and He never tires of forgiving us.

As we go about our day, let us ask God to give us the grace of repentance to welcome Christ, his Son, and our Cornerstone, into our life so that we can bear much fruit in His Vineyard. And let us thank Him for choosing us to work in His vineyard in spite of our brokenness. God calls us to bear good fruit and to be good stewards of his vineyard.

We are grateful to the parents who have already registered their children for our Religious Education and Confirmation programs. Classes started last Sunday on the campus of St. Gabriel. It was such a joy to see the excitement and enthusiasm in the eyes of the children. Classes are held according to grade levels. **Religious education is for all children,** and not just for those preparing for First Eucharist. Give your child the gift of growing in faith!

AN INVITATION FROM DEACON STEVE: BE A PART OF THE

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL!



(Reflection for October 1st)
We are blessed as Catholics to have received a special gift from our Lord,
Jesus Christ. At the Last Supper he initiated the Holy Eucharist. He proclaimed that the bread and wine of Holy Mass is consecrated through the


priest's actions at the Eucharistic Prayer, become his Body and Blood. While still in the form of bread and wine, in substance it becomes the Body and Blood of himself, Jesus Christ. When we consume the Host at Communion, a part of Jesus becomes a part of us. With that knowledge and belief, we should allow ourselves to be transformed to be in a holy union with the Lord. Many Christians view communion as merely symbolic. However, the Catholic Church takes Christ's words at the Last Supper literally. He did not say that the bread and wine were merely symbolic of his body and blood. Scripture says, "While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, 'Take and eat; this is my body. Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins." (Matt. 26: 26-28) We should not take the Holy Eucharist and the Real Presence for granted. "When we receive Holy Communion, we experience something extraordinary - a joy, a fragrance, a well-being that thrills the whole body and causes it to exalt." (St. John Vianney).

(Reflection for October 8th)

Recently I was listening to a deacon on the radio who spoke of the importance of sensing REVERENCE in our houses of worship if we wish to feel the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. It made me think back nearly twenty years ago to the parish where my daughter went to Mass in little Union, West Virginia. The parish in the town of Ronceverte, WV, that operated a satellite location for Catholics in southern Monroe County out of a century old house. Chairs were set up in what used to be the parlor and dining room and the priest would celebrate Mass for the 7 to 35 congregants who would gather each week. I joined my daughter and granddaughters there on a couple of occasions and experienced a sense of reverence that emanated from the faithful gathered there. It was amazing. Sometimes, though, the sense of deep reverence can also be found in the physical space in which we worship. With great anticipation we should look forward to when the interior of our own St. Charles Borromeo Church will have this phase of the restoration completed. As Father Canisius has noted, "Our church building will be as beautiful as many that one can see in Rome!" St. Claude de la Colombiere has said, "It is in our churches, in this tabernacle, that the living Body of the Savior rests. He was but nine months in the womb of Mary, three hours on the cross, three days in the tomb. Yet he is always in our churches. This is why they do not empty of angels, archangels, and seraphim unceasingly adoring him." Let us sense the Real Presence of Jesus in the tabernacle of our sanctuary and in the hearts of our parishioners gathered to receive him in the Eucharist.


