PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

✠ A REFLECTION FROM BIENVENU ✠

Dear Friends in Christ,

In today's first reading, Jerusalem is threatened by the Assyrian invaders. Its surroundings are ravaged. In this context, Isaiah's prophecy appears as an announcement of hope that the disastrous situation will end. One day, the people of Israel will see the festival marking the end of an old world, and all the people will come to join in the feast. In Psalm 23, the Psalmist sings of the happy certainty of the people who know that they are being guided by the Lord to a place of plenty, to the table of feasting.

In the Gospel of today, Matthew tells us that God is too respectful of our freedom to constrain us. He invites us to His party and waits for our goodwill to respond to His invitation. He does not force us. The first guests are Jews, as part of His chosen people. The servants who come to call them are the prophets, who have come one after the other to make known God's invitation. The new guests are all of us, as members of the Church, for the feast is now open to all. For us to enter into the banquet hall, we need to clothe ourselves with the garments of love, forgiveness, peace, and mercy to others, as our God shows of those to us through Jesus.

God, the Host of the party, invites us to come to join Him in the feast of His kingdom. He does not select the guests. His invitation is for us all. He invites us to come to receive His mercy and forgiveness. His call is the invitation of conversion. We are all called to come enter into His great mercy, regardless of our life path.

The parable challenges us to discover the face of our loving God, who always seeks us and calls us to come to share his life. Our God of love and mercy invites each one of us to come to Him. Let us give thanks to God for inviting us to come to take part in His Feast. By gathering on this day, we recommit to our acceptance of it. Around the table of the Lord, we find our deepest and truest identity, and the grace we receive encourages and strengthens us in our lifelong preparation for our attendance at the heavenly wedding feast. Here, today, we get a foretaste of that great and glorious banquet. May it strengthen our faith in the promise that awaits us.

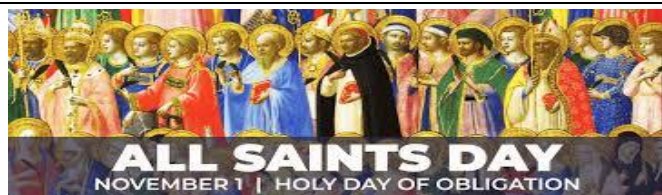

AN INVITATION FROM DEACON STEVE:

BE A PART OF THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL!



As your deacon, one of the things I would like to offer the parishioners at St. Charles once our renovations are complete are more opportunities for holy hour devotions associated with particular special days or intentions.

Many of our parishioners came to the United States from countries where Christians are being persecuted, kidnapped, or even killed. The Knights of Columbus has a special prayer service for persecuted Christians. We also hope to have the Knights' icon of St. Joseph available for a service sometime near his feast day of March 19. There are a number of other celebrations where a holy hour will be appropriate. During these holy hours we will have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Jesus physically and substantially present in Body, but in the form of the consecrated bread. While adoring Jesus Christ in the Real Presence we can ask our Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, and other holy people to spiritually kneel beside us in prayer for whatever special intention is being offered. Eucharistic Adoration is a source of spiritual food for our souls. Venerable Fulton J. Sheen noted, *"The greatest love story of all time is contained in a tiny white host."* With that in mind, we should strive to make the "new" St. Charles Borromeo Church a "POWERHOUSE OF PRAYER" as we head into a new liturgical year. **"Lord be merciful. Jesus, save your people! Amen."**

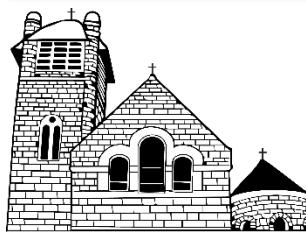

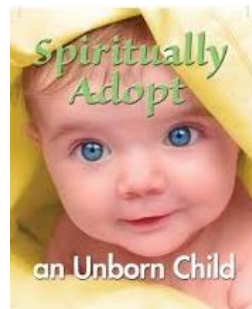

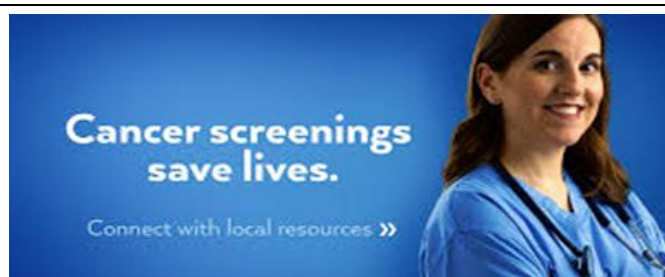
