PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

○ A REFLECTION FROM BIENVENU ∞

Dear Friends in Christ,

I notice that many governments around the world very often refuse to give to God what belongs to God. Others manipulate religion for their own interests and grant the Church certain privileges in order to better control it by imposing their own ideology on it. The state plays an important role in our lives, but it cannot have a monopoly on us. Caesar is not all-powerful; he is not our God. It is significant to us Christians that Jesus emphasizes our duties to God when the Pharisees ask about our duties to the emperor. Though Jesus never wanted to prevent us from being responsible citizens, He tells us that politics is not the only reality in our lives.

The Gospel of today reminds each one of us that there is no emperor, no dictator, and no head of government who can control everything in our lives. They are human beings, as we are. The coin presented by the Pharisees bore the image of the emperor, which means it belonged to him. But we are created in the image of God: "male and female He created them, and in his own image he created them (Gen. 1)." So, we all belong to God.

Seeing how our society is becoming more and more materialistic, I believe that this Gospel challenges us to put all our trust in God alone. We can pay respect to the emperor, but we cannot worship him. He is not divine; he is not God. As Peter reminds Christians in any circumstances: "we must obey God rather than men (Acts 5: 29)." So, Jesus Christ repeats to us that Caesar is Caesar, but he is not God. I hope that political power, whatever it may be, is not given the opportunity to invade our conscience and take hold of our whole human being. That is, governments can never force us to act against our conscience. This is why Jesus says: "Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." In a pluralistic world, governments are occasionally called to pass laws and regulations that run counter to our own Christian values, but this should not prevent us from exercising our Christian freedom and acting in accordance with our own conscience.

As we go about our day, let us ask the Almighty God to give us grace, to discern and distinguish between these things that belong to Caesar and those that belong to God. Let us always remember that we are created in God's Image.





AN INVITATION FROM DEACON STEVE: BE A PART OF THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL!



Between May and October of 2017, three young children in Fatima, Portugal, experienced visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary. These apparitions concluded on October 13, 2017, with an event that is now called the "Miracle

of the Sun". 70,000 people witnessed the sun change colors, spin in circles and appear to dive toward the earth. One of the children, Lucia dos Santos, had informed the public that Mary had predicted this event would take place. The miracle was widely reported in the secular press. Lucia eventually became a nun and died in 2005 just short of her 98th birthday. Now known as Servant of God. Lucia dos Santos. God-willing, she is on the path to beatification and canonization. Devoted to the Holy Eucharist and the rosary, Sister Lucia noted, "After the Holy Liturgy of the Eucharist, the prayer of the rosary is what better draws our spirit to the mysteries of Faith, Hope, and Charity. The rosary is the spiritual bread of souls." The St. Charles Borromeo parish's Legion of Mary leads the praying of the rosary every Sunday following the celebration of the 8:30am Mass. The Legion invites all parishioners to join them in this devotion and encourages other parishes to initiate a similar practice. Undoubtedly, Sister Lucia is smiling on us from heaven. "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us now and at the hour of our death. Amen."
