

#### **○** A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS ∞

Dear Parishioners,

Today the word of God is calling us to be wise. We hear about beautiful Wisdom, personified as a woman, in our first reading. She is *seeking those worthy of her*. The Lord Jesus calls us to wisdom by using the example of the wise virgins in the Gospel. Since we don't want to be like the foolish virgins who missed entry into the Reign of God, how, then, do we become wise?

The Scriptures tell us that wisdom is a gift from God. In fact, we are taught that *fear of the Lord* is the beginning of wisdom (Prv 9:10). The first thing we need to do is ask for wisdom. If we seek wisdom from God we are promised that we will receive. We need to pray for wisdom, especially when there are important decisions to be made. We are also told that we must be willing to listen to wisdom if we are to receive it (Prv 2:2; 19:20). While the gift of wisdom is given generously and freely by God, if we reject the movement of wisdom in our hearts, we will still end up foolish.

Wisdom is one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. If we want to be truly wise, we must seek to follow the lead of the Holy Spirit even when it is difficult. Wisdom is that deeper knowledge that helps us to see the path of God in our lives. Only the wise can tell the difference between lies that we want to be true, and the truth of God's plan that may include some pain or disappointment. Wisdom is patient as the Lord's plan unfolds and we see the beauty of his will in our lives. Wisdom seeks what God wants, and not simply what we want. It is a great gift, especially for those in leadership. The Lord Jesus calls us to embrace the gift of wisdom and to ask for that gift from the Holy Spirit. As long as we have the humility and patience to trust in the Lord's plan, we will receive all the wisdom we need.

Thank you for a beautiful celebration last Sunday as we began our 175<sup>th</sup> year-long celebrations. I look forward to celebrating with you! I got my ticket for the Anniversary Dinner on November 18. I am bringing a bottle of wine to dinner! And then we welcome the Archbishop at the 11:00 am Mass on November 19 as he re-dedicates our altar and blesses our new Tabernacle.

God's grace is with us always.



# MESSAGE #24 FROM DEACON STEVE FOR THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



How often do we find ourselves coming to Sunday Mass simply out of habit or a fear that an unexcused absence will cause us to be in sin? We venture to our parish church out of routine. As a result we say the

words of the prayers - the Gloria, the Creed, the Our Father -- in an almost robotic way. Of course, it is always good that we are there to join with the community in prayer and to receive our Lord in the Real Presence of the Eucharist. But do we cheat ourselves of the graces that we could receive if only our focus had been more defined? We can address that problem by motivating our presence at Mass to be not one of habit or fear of sin, but rather being driven by a LOVE for the Mass and all that takes place there. St. Josemaria Escriva gives us powerful advice when he urges, "A (person) who fails to love the Mass fails to love Christ. We must make an effort to live the Mass with calm and serenity, with devotion and affection. Those who love acquire a finesse, a sensitivity of soul that makes them notice details that are sometimes very small, but that are important because they express the love of a passionate heart. This is how we should attend Holy Mass. And this is why I have always suspected that those who want the Mass to be over quickly show, with this insensitive attitude, that they have not yet realized what the sacrifice of the altar means." We should make an effort of love to focus on those little details within the prayers we know by heart, and those prayed by the priest in the prayers of Consecration. When we do that every time we participate in Holy Mass, we will receive an abundance of grace that will fuel our lifelong journey of faith and aid us in our spiritual renewal as daughters and sons of a loving God. "Holy Spirit, come into my heart and fill me with wisdom, patience, and faith. Amen."

In all, we filled about 10 contractor-sized trash bags with ivy, weeds, and other growth. In the driveway, we found an old tire, a baseball, rusted wire fencing, and a handicap parking sign. Sandy and Tom took two pick-up truckloads of vines and tree limbs...and there is still another load to pick up. The jungle along the driveway is much less dense. The trees will be so happy that the vines are no longer choking them off.

As you can tell, there is still a lot of work yet to do to get our church campus looking in tip-top shape. Look for notices on future clean-ups in the bulletin or on-line. Thank you to all who have helped clean up the church grounds!
