PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

□ A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS □

Dear Parishioners,

As we begin a new liturgical year, we remember that God, our Father, has enriched us with his Spirit. At times, however, we ignore what God has done for us and wander off on our own path. In the Gospel today Jesus tells his disciples to be alert, to be ready, and to watch. In short, he tells them to be full of hope. How ready are we? How full of hope?

Jesus compares himself to a master of the house who has gone traveling abroad, leaving others behind in charge of his household. We can assume a few things about their responsibilities. They should guard the property, keep it up, and care for the land. But this is not all. Jesus today focuses on the stance that these servants ought to take up, their posture so to speak. He says they ought to be ready to welcome the master home at a moment's notice. They should be alert and watchful. They should not only be good stewards – maintaining and caring for the household – they should be oriented toward the master at all times, eagerly hoping for his return.

Advent is a season of hope, and this parable makes clear that our hope cannot be passive. Hope is an activity for the Christian, not simply a passive state of being. Hope is one of the theological virtues, and like the other virtues it requires action. To be virtuous first requires building up a sort of habit of doing the good – a state of being which is inclined to do the good. The courageous person is ready to face his or her fear and fight for the good. In this way, virtues such as hope are a sort of passive state of being. But virtues are also activities. They must be actualized – made real – by some specific action. The courageous person must not only be ready to face his or her fear, but must actually feel some specific fear and actually pursue the good in spite of it.

Hope is a desire, a longing, for some future and difficult-to-obtain happiness. Ultimately, it is a longing for nothing less than the return of Christ and our eternal union with him. This is the posture, the attitude, that Jesus describes in the servants of the traveling master. It is not enough for them to be good stewards of the house who passively wait for his coming. They should be on the watch – actively looking for him.

As you look back at the past year, how have you failed to keep alert and walk in God's ways? Find time this Advent season to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation and acknowledge your need for God's mercy and guidance.

Christians during this Advent season must be fully alive and fully engaged. We must be active in our pursuit of the Lord, looking around every corner and eager for his return. We must be people of hope! Now that we are done with our church renovations, I hope to see all of you return to church. Invite someone to join our community. Have a blessed week!





MESSAGE #27 FROM DEACON STEVE FOR THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



Servant of God, Frank Duff, was an Irish layman (1889-1980) who in 1921 founded the Legion of Mary. That organization which is active to this day around the globe and in our own St. Charles Borromeo parish.

promotes service to the Catholic Church on a voluntary basis. Mr. Duff was devoted to the Catholic Church, the Blessed Mother, and to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. He was a missionary to the poor and marginalized people of his community. Duff was a tireless defender of the Catholic faith and put his beliefs into action by loving God and loving his neighbor just as Jesus Christ had commanded. His additional devotion to the Real Presence of Jesus, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Eucharist, was a driving force in the holy work he aimed to accomplish in his 91 years on the earth. A particularly wise and memorable lesson that he gave us in regard to the Blessed Sacrament is this: "That Jesus whom others admire, Catholics possess - ever living in the Eucharist. They have free access to him and can, and should, receive him even daily as the food of their souls." Jesus promised that he would be with us until the end of time (see Matthew 28:20). Consider receiving our Lord in the Eucharist not only on Sundays, but also one or more times at a weekday Mass. "Holy Spirit, fill me with a desire to receive Jesus in the Eucharist as food for my journey of faith."




